**BOROUGH OF MONTVALE
ORDINANCE NO. 2013-1376**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, SUPPLEMENTING THE BOROUGH CODE TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 90B ENTITLED, "RECREATION"

BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale as follows:

Section 1. The Code of the Borough of Montvale is hereby supplemented by adding a new Chapter 90B, "Recreation," as follows:

Article I – Recreation Director

- §90B-1. Creation of position.**
- §90B-2. Appointment; term; removal from office.**
- §90B-3. Compensation.**
- §90B-4. Qualifications; residence.**
- §90B-5. Powers, duties and responsibilities.**

§90B-1. Creation of position.

The position of Recreation Director in the Borough of Montvale is hereby created.

§90B-2. Appointment; term; removal from office.

- A. The Recreation Director shall be appointed annually by the Mayor and Council.
- B. Unless removed in accordance with this section, the term of the Recreation Director shall be one year.
- C. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Recreation Director shall serve at the pleasure of the Mayor and Council.

§90B-3. Compensation.

The salary of the Recreation Director shall be as set forth in the Borough's salary ordinance.

§90B-4. Qualifications; residence.

The Director of Recreation shall be trained thoroughly versed in modern recreation theory and practice. The Recreation Director need not be a resident of the Borough.

§90B-5. Powers, duties and responsibilities.

The Recreation Director shall be under the direct supervision and control of the Borough Administrator, subject to the oversight of the Mayor and Council. The Recreation Director shall have such powers and responsibilities, and shall perform such duties as, but not limited to, the following:

- A. Administering, planning, supervising and conducting programs and activities of the Borough's public playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation centers and other recreational facilities and any of the properties owned and controlled by the Borough, including, but not limited to, recreational programs, cultural activities, youth programs and the summer camp, in conjunction with the Recreation Committee, subject to formal approval by the Mayor and Council.
- B. The Recreation Director will be an alternate to the Field Coordinator for purposes of coordination and scheduling all Borough owned athletic fields.
- C. Planning and promoting the immediate and long-term recreational needs of the Borough.
- D. Recommending in writing to the Mayor & Council for approval the hiring of such counselors, supervisors, play leaders, instructors and other personnel as the Council may from time to time deem appropriate.
- E. Attend all meetings of the Recreation Committee.
- F. Provide monthly reports in writing to the Borough Administrator and Council Liaison detailing such information, including but not limited to revenues, expenditures, program attendance, upcoming programs, and any staffing recommendations for upcoming programs.
- G. Attending meetings of the Mayor and Council upon request.
- H. In conjunction with the Recreation Committee, providing an annual report to the Mayor and Council, no later than December 31 of each year, containing a comprehensive and detailed report covering operations, receipts, disbursements and expenditures for the full year, including a short- and long-term plan for the Recreation Department.

Article II – Recreation Committee

§90B-6. Creation.

There is hereby created in the Borough of Montvale a Recreation Committee.

§90B-7. Composition; terms of office.

The Recreation Committee shall consist of such members as shall be appointed by the Mayor, along with the Recreation Director. However, the Recreation Committee shall consist of no fewer than five (5) members, exclusive of the Recreation Director. Each member of the Recreation Committee shall be an annual appointment. A member of the Borough Council shall serve as liaison to the Recreation Committee but shall not be a member of said Committee.

§90B-8. Organization.

- A. The Recreation Committee shall select from among its members one individual to serve as Chairperson of the Board. The Chairperson in the absence of the Recreation Director shall preside over all meetings of the Recreation Committee.
- B. The Recreation Committee may also appoint a Vice-Chairperson in his/her absence.

§90B-9. Purpose; duties; responsibilities.

- A. The purpose of the Recreation Committee is to assist the Recreation Director and the Mayor and Council in administering, planning, supervising and conducting programs and activities of the Borough's public playgrounds, athletic fields, recreation centers and other recreational facilities and any of the properties owned and controlled by the Borough, including, but not limited to, recreational programs, cultural activities, youth programs and the summer camp, subject to formal approval by the Mayor and Council.
- B. The Recreation Committee shall make recommendations to the Mayor and Council regarding recreational programs, personnel and facilities, the development of new initiatives, and the management of existing programs in the Borough of Montvale.
- C. The Recreation Committee shall advise the Recreation Director in the preparation of the annual budget for the Recreation Department.

- D. The Recreation Committee shall maintain communication including but not limited to recreational quasi-municipal organizations in order to coordinate the use of facilities and establish consistent policies and cooperation among the various groups.
- E. The Recreation Committee shall advise the Mayor and Council of any opportunities or needs that should be addressed in the area of recreation.
- F. The Recreation Committee shall maintain communication with other municipal bodies, such as the library and the schools, to minimize duplication of efforts and to foster joint programs.
- G. The members of the Recreation Committee are to maintain the ethical standards of the position of trust to which they have been appointed. Any ethical breach or conduct unbecoming of a member of the Board shall be reported immediately to the Mayor and Council for appropriate action, including, but not limited to, removal from the Recreation Committee as permitted by law.
- H. All decisions and/or recommendations made by the Recreation Committee, including whether to offer particular programs, program fees and personnel decisions are subject to approval by the Mayor and Council.
- I. All individuals over the age of 18 working directly with children are subject to a background check.

§90B-10. Studies; recommendations and reports.

- A. The Recreation Committee may make recommendations to the Mayor and Council as to the establishment of any new staff positions it deems necessary for the successful operation of the Borough's recreational programs. The responsibility for the hiring of such employees shall be vested with the Mayor and Borough Council and any such employees shall be under the immediate supervision of the Recreation Director, who in turn shall be under the supervision of the Borough Administrator.
- B. On or before January 15 of each year, the Recreation Committee, in cooperation with the Recreation Director shall prepare and submit to the Borough Administrator a proposed budget for the Borough's recreation program. Prior thereto, the Recreation Committee shall obtain and review budget requests from each of the various recreational programs which shall be used in the budget preparation process. The budgetary requests shall also be submitted to the Borough Administrator for the purpose of substantiating the Recreation Committee's suggested budget.
- C. The Recreation Committee shall also study such matters as may be referred to it by the Mayor and Council and shall report its findings and conclusions thereon, in writing, to the Mayor and Council as soon as reasonably possible.

Section 2. Effect of invalidation. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

Section 3. Repeal of inconsistent ordinances. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Borough of Montvale which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

Section 4. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

Mayor Fyfe asked for another motion to open to the public for a second time to address further questions by the public - Motion to open meeting to the public for a second time to further answer further questions by Councilmember Lane; seconded by Councilmember Talarico

Motion to close meeting to the public by Councilmember Talarico; seconded by Councilmember Cudequest - a roll call was taken Councilmembers Lane, Ghassali and LaMonica – no Councilmembers Talarico, Cudequest and Curry - yes – Mayor Fyfe broke the tie to close the meeting to the public

PUBLIC HEARING OF ORDINANCE NO. 2013-1375 ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE, COUNTY OF BERGEN, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 84 OF THE BOROUGH CODE TO REVISE CERTAIN PROVISIONS CONCERNING PROMOTIONS IN THE POLICE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale Police Department is in the process of obtaining Accreditation from the Commission of Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies ("CALEA") to better improve its standards and the quality of services provided to the Borough of Montvale; and **WHEREAS**, in connection therewith, the Borough's Accreditation consultant and the Joint Insurance Fund have recommended certain changes to the Borough's promotion policy; and **WHEREAS**, the Borough is desirous of adopting a comprehensive promotion policy to be administered by the Borough by and through the Chief of Police in order to establish a fully fair and open promotional process in the Borough of Montvale Police Department.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

Section 1. The following sections of Chapter 84 of the Code of the Borough of Montvale are hereby amended and supplemented by adding the underlined text and deleting the [bracketed] text, as follows:

§84-11. Grounds for removal.

Any member of the Police Department may be removed from office, suspended and/or fined, as herein provided for, in addition to any other punishment to which he may be subject by law, against whom any of the following charges may have been substantiated:

Y. Violation of the Montvale Police Department Rules and Regulations.

§ 84-12. Appointments as policemen.

All appointments as policemen of the Police Department of the Borough of Montvale shall be made from a list prepared by the Mayor and Council after examination and with special reference to the fitness of the person so appointed. Appointments shall be made for a probationary period of 12 months from the completion of the approved Police Training Commission (PTC) police certification courts, or for pre-certified appointees, 12 months from the date of hire, after which period, the probationary appointee may be eligible for a permanent appointment. Said list shall be in force for a period of one year from the time of certification. All appointments by the Mayor and Council to the Police Department shall be made from the list of applicants who have passed the written, oral and physical examinations as well as a comprehensive background investigation as provided in this ordinance, subject to the provisions hereof. [No appointment shall be made until said appointee shall have completed his basic training period of 12 months.]

§ 84-13. Examination by Examining Board required.

- A. Applicants for appointment to the Police Department of the Borough of Montvale shall be required to submit themselves to such examination as may be required by the Police Examining Board designated by the Chief of Police[Mayor and Council].
- B. No applicant shall receive consideration for appointment to the Police Department unless he shall have received a passing grade and successfully completed the entire appointment process as required by the Chief of Police. The Chief of Police will provide a list of finalists and recommendations to the Mayor and Council for consideration for appointment. [; provided, however, that the f]Final determination for appointment [as to the fitness of the appointee] shall be reserved to the [sole discretion of the] Mayor and Council.

§ 84-15. Promotions.

A. Chief of Police.

- (1) Whenever a vacancy or impending vacancy for the position of Chief of Police occurs within the Montvale Police Department, the Mayor will empanel an Examining Board to conduct evaluations of all applications, which may include but not be limited to written and oral skills, management ability, psychological assessment and other pertinent areas of performance-related matters. [All applicants shall submit to the Examining Board a resume outlining in detail experience and educational background. The Examining Board shall conduct evaluations of all applicants, which may include but not be limited to written and oral skills, management ability, psychological assessment and other pertinent areas of performance-related matters.] The Examining Board shall submit the name of at least one candidate to the Mayor for appointment.
- (2) The Mayor and Council will determine application eligibility criteria before announcing the opening to members of the Police Department. All eligible applicants shall submit to the Examining Board a resume outlining in detail his or her experience and educational background. The Examining Board may require an independent examination by the New Jersey State Police Chiefs Association, the International Association of Chiefs of Police or other comparable testing entity. The testing entity will develop and conduct an grade an examination that will consist of a series of multiple-choice questions, or an oral examination and then grade the oral examination. The Mayor or his designee may submit or suggest any appropriate topic areas or questions to the outside testing entity to be included in the examination. These questions will be based upon police practices and may include police and investigative procedures, supervisory and administrative principles, New Jersey criminal law, report writing, search and seizure issues, New Jersey Attorney General Guidelines and Directives and legal aspects and requirements of police work. The Mayor or his designee shall provide a written announcement of the reading list or syllabus of possible sources of materials utilized in developing the test in order for candidates to prepare for the written examination.
- (3) The candidates will be required to submit to any additional testing or evaluations such as a psychological evaluation that the Examining Board deems appropriate.
- (4) [(2)] The Mayor may accept or reject the recommendation(s) of the Examining Board. If the Mayor selects a candidate recommended by the Examining Board, he shall appoint a Chief of Police, with the advice and consent of the Borough Council.
- (5) [(3)] If the Mayor does not find any candidate of the Examining Board to be suitable, he may select another person to fill the vacancy of Chief of Police and appoint said person, with the advice and consent of the Borough Council.
- (6) [(4)] In the event that the Mayor fails or refuses to make a selection as above provided for within a reasonable time after a vacancy in the office is determined to exist, then in such event, the Council may, on motion, appoint such person as it deems qualified, subject to the provisions of this ordinance.

B. All other promotions.

- (1) Whenever a vacancy in a higher rank occurs, the Chief of Police shall submit a request to the Mayor and Council to fill the vacancy. If approved, the Chief of

Police will then initiate the promotion procedure as outlined by the current Promotion Policy in the Montvale Police Department. The Appropriate Authority (Montvale Mayor and Council) reserves the right to make the final determination for promotion from any one of the top three (3) scoring candidates from the sergeant, lieutenant or captain eligibility list. In the event of numerous promotional openings during the life span of the promotional list, the number 4, 5 and 6 ranking candidates may be considered if they have received a passing score on the total examination. In no case will a candidate be promoted over another candidate who was ranked more than two positions higher on the final eligibility list. The Chief of Police or his designee will provide the Mayor and Council with the eligibility list and provide advice to the Mayor and Council about the finalists. [, upon request, submit to the Mayor and Council the name(s) of qualified personnel to fill the vacant position. The Examining Board shall conduct an examination, written or oral, or both, as to physical, mental and other qualifications for such promotion and invite the recommendations of the Chief as well as other qualified candidates to participate in the evaluation process. A list of all candidates passing the examination shall be filed with the Mayor and Council for its review, The Mayor and Council shall interview each candidate and select the individual who, in its opinion, is best suited for the position, provided that the governing body deems it appropriate that such vacancy be filled.]

- (2) Eligibility for promotions, testing criteria, appeals processes as well as point valuation for seniority, education, performance and discipline are outlined in the Montvale Police Department Policy. [Applicants for promotion shall be required to submit themselves to an examination as may be required by the Examining Board. The Mayor shall appoint a Chief of Police subject to the same being confirmed by a majority vote of the Borough Council.]
- (3) All promotions shall be made in accordance with the Promotion Policy for the Borough of Montvale Police Department, a copy of which is on file in the Montvale Police Department. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the Chief of Police is expressly authorized to relax certain provisions of the Montvale Police Department Promotion Policy, as set forth within the Promotion Policy, when deemed necessary to meet the administrative needs of the Police Department. [The Examining Board shall conduct examinations, written or oral, or both, as to physical, mental and other qualifications for such promotions. Upon the holding of each examination, the Examining Board shall rate said applicants and certify the rating of all such applicants to the Mayor and Council. Promotions shall be made according to such ratings, giving consideration to length of service, knowledge of duties, ability, integrity, dedication to employment, responsibility and tactfulness in the conduct of duty by past record, and only after a personal interview with the Mayor and Police Committee.]

C. General provisions. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, all promotions shall be made with due regard to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-129 and N.J.S.A. 40A:14-130.

Section 2. Adoption of Promotion Policy.

The Mayor and Council hereby adopt the Promotion Policy attached hereto for the Borough of Montvale Police Department, a copy of which is on file in the Borough of Montvale Police Department. This Promotion Policy shall be effective immediately and shall supersede any prior promotion policy for the Montvale Police Department.

Section 3. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 4. Savings Clause.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed pursuant to this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 5. Severability.







General Notes:

- The roads listed in this document will be reduced and/or modified depending on the amount of funds available and the completion of the County Aid ADA Curb Ramp Program. No road will be paved until all ADA compliant Curb Ramps have been constructed along that road.
- The County Engineer or Assistant County Engineer may add additional locations or delete any location during construction of the project based on the funding available.
- The number of locations that can be worked on at any one time will be two (2). The County Engineer, Assistant County Engineer or County Inspector must first approve any work on more than two (2) locations at a time.
- Where Imprint®, Stamped Concrete, Brick Pavers or similar material is encountered in the roadway for crosswalks or decorative pavement, the contractor will use protective measures to preserve the material prior to and during milling and paving operations. Any material damaged by the contractor will be repaired at the expense of the contractor. No separate payment will be made for protective measures but the cost will be included in the various pay items in the bid proposal.
- Milling and/or resurfacing will not be permitted on the bridges and culverts as shown on the enclosed location maps unless approved by the County Engineer, Assistant County Engineer or County Inspector.
- The testing of the HMA for compliance to composition, air voids and thickness in accordance with Sections 401 and 902 shall be performed on each listed road individually.
- The layout of the Traffic Stripes and Markings will be the responsibility of the contractor, **only when required and instructed by the County Engineer, Assistant County Engineer or County Inspector**, with information provided by the Bergen County Department of Public Works, Operation Division. The contractor is responsible for temporary stripes to keep the road open and must install permanent traffic stripes and markings within 72 hours of completion of the paving operation.
- The details enclosed in this document for Traffic Control may not always apply to the specific roadway in this project. The details were obtained from the New Jersey Department of Transportation for work on a State Highway. The contractor will determine the placement of the Construction Signs, Breakaway Barricades, Drums and Traffic Cones required for each roadway in accordance with the current MANUAL ON UNIFORM TRAFFIC CONTROL DEVICES. The quantities bid are estimates only and the actual quantities will be determined in the field by the contractor in accordance with the MANUAL and approved by the County Engineer, Assistant County Engineer or County Inspector.
- The quantities bid for Traffic Control, Items 2 - 5, will be measured once for maximum amount of locations that can be worked on at any one time (2 locations). Separate payment will not be made for the relocation of the devices within the project limits and between locations. Additional quantities for Items 2 - 5 will only be allowed if approved by the County Engineer, Assistant County Engineer or County Inspector. The bid items 2 - 5 including Construction Signs, Breakaway Barricades, Drums and Traffic Cones shall be paid one time over the life of the entire contract and shall be made available for use on the entire project for that one time payment.
- Traffic Director, Flagger – the unit price bid for this pay item cannot exceed the New Jersey Department of Labor and Workforce Development Prevailing Wage Determination, including fringe benefits, for the Laborer Class for Flagman, Traffic Director/Controller at the time of construction. The maximum unit price payment is stated in the Project Bid Proposals.
- Traffic Director, Police, required by the municipality in which the project is located, in addition to the Traffic Director, Flagger will be provided by the municipality at no cost to the contractor.

Dear Mayor and Council,

Nightmares Haunted Attraction is planning on implementing a new feature to its hayride for this season, which involves the use of 100% biodegradable paintballs. A sample has been included with this letter for your convenience. These paintballs are 100% non toxic, bio degradable, and simply wash away with water. The device used to deliver the paintballs to their target is a toy spring loaded gun, bright red in color, and sold at Walmart throughout the state of New Jersey. These toys are made for children 9yrs and up. Since they are spring loaded, and not the high powered, high velocity paintball guns as used throughout the state by paint ball events, the balls are ejected at a low velocity that will not cause bruising or pain when received by an opposite party, requiring no additional safety gear except eye protection, which we will provide.

It should be further noted that our customers will not be fired at, and will not be shooting at other customers or even at our own employees. The hayride will be automated, meaning our customers will be shooting at inanimate objects. Still, every customer will receive eye protection for their safety, and an adult will be on every wagon to review rules, safety procedures, and to explain the use of the toy guns. The paintballs will only be used on our hayride, NOT during the "walk".

We have emailed our plans to Mr. Ludwig of fire prevention, and in turn, that information was forwarded to Chief Abrams. We received an email from Chief Abrams that stated the following:

Sir,

New Jersey Statutes may not allow the type of gun you intend to use.

2C:39-1f. states:

"Firearm" means any handgun, rifle, shotgun, machine gun, automatic or semi-automatic rifle, or any gun, device or instrument in the nature of a weapon from which may be fired or ejected any solid projectable ball, slug, pellet, missile or bullet, or any gas, vapor or other noxious thing, by means of a cartridge or shell or by the action of an explosive or the igniting of flammable or explosive substances. It shall also include, without limitation, any firearm which is in the nature of an air gun, **spring gun** or pistol or other weapon of a similar nature in which the **propelling force is a spring**, elastic band, carbon dioxide, compressed or other gas or vapor, air or compressed air, or is ignited by compressed air, and **ejecting a bullet or missile smaller than three-eighths of an inch in diameter**, with sufficient force to injure a person.

2C:39-5b. states:

b. Handguns. Any person who knowingly has in his possession any handgun, including any antique handgun, without first having obtained a permit to carry the same as provided in N.J.S.2C:58-4, is guilty of a crime of the third degree if the handgun is in the nature of an air gun, **spring gun** or pistol or other weapon of a similar nature in which **the propelling force is a spring**, elastic band, carbon dioxide, compressed or other gas or vapor, air or compressed air, or is ignited by compressed air, and **ejecting a**

bullet or missile smaller than three-eighths of an inch in diameter, with sufficient force to injure a person. Otherwise it is a crime of the second degree.

He highlighted several points for us as you can see above. We greatly appreciate this information and we are extremely pleased it was addressed. As mentioned in our response to Chief Abrams, the statues listed above do not apply to these toys. The balls being ejected from the toy guns are not solid in nature. They are hollow, and are very fragile and soft. The device is also not firing a bullet or a missile, and is not doing so at a force that could injure a person. Lastly, we provided a link to the Walmart in Saddle Brook that is currently selling this toy. Much more powerful paintballs are in use all over the state legally, as paintball events take place on farms, inside arenas, at parks, and are a very much loved family sporting event. We chose this particular type of toy gun due to the additional safety it provides. Also, having removed our employees from being fired at all but eliminates the possibility of an injury. We can only fit a maximum of 10-12 people on each hayride as everyone must fire off the same side of the wagon. So it's a very controlled and well organized venue. Our general liability insurance also completely covers us for this type of event, as well as our workers comp insurance for the workers on the hayride.

We greatly thank you for taking the time to review this matter, and we look forward to providing our customers with a new haunted attraction experience that will continue the family friendly tradition we have embraced since our very first year.
