From the Tax Department

Excess Sewer Charges are due April 1, 2020. Grace period has been extended to April 30, 2020. After April 30, interest will revert back to April 1.

Property taxes are due May 1, 2020. Grace period will be to Monday, May 11. After May 11, interest will revert back to May 1. For your convenience, a dropbox is located curbside by main entrance of Library and you may also pay online through the borough website at www.montvale.org

The Mayor's Corner

At the time of writing if this article, we are in the process of closing our parks and municipal building and canceling all meetings and activities due to the Coronavirus outbreak. We are experiencing new ways of conducting business in town and using new ways to communicate among the different departments.

The information about presumptive and confirmed positives for COVID-19 patients is compiled from the healthcare facilities and sorted to the county. We at the municipal level, OEM and local Board of Health get the information from the county. They tell us only the number of positives. First responders receive the same numbers but with addresses to alert them in case they need to enter those addresses for

The patients who test positive, if they are not hospitalized, are told they are on mandatory quarantine, and a healthcare professional checks on them by phone regularly. A nurse is assigned to each patient. The nurse interviews the patient and follows up on the close contacts with strict instructions to each person contacted.

At the local level, we don't have the authority to force the quarantine without a court order, and although HIPAA does not apply to us, it applies to the healthcare professionals and prohibits them from sharing the information with us. I have requested from the county to at least share the number of recoveries for our towns as we move forward. I have been asked to share more information, I can't share information I don't have.

You have been hearing, and

unfortunately it is very true, we will see more positives showing up in the next few days. We are still on the climb of the curve, and I hope we are close to the tip and will see a decline soon. The best

advice is to assume that infected patients have been to all over town, so stay home and use the following guidelines.



- When walking, keep the 6 feet distance rule
- Sanitize your home and car at least once a day
- Wash your hands often
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.

With these changes in our area, the goodness of our residents shines every time. More than 25 residents offered their time to help our elderly in town. It started with a simple post by Nancy Broderick and ended with an organized program that does wellness checks and safe handling delivery of essentials. Everyone involved in this program is a hero in my book and will be recognized appropriately in due time.

We all want to get back to normalcy and do what we each like to do, but we also want to be safe and healthy.] As always, I am always available for anything I can help with, don't hesitate to contact me.

As we get into the warmer weather, our attention will turn to yard cleanup from the mild winter we had in our area. Thankfully, we dodged a brutal winter (snow and ice wise) so we can get an early start on yard cleanup.

Individual residents and property owners will need to assess any damage to their property. All branches laying on the ground as well as broken branches still hanging in the tree will need to be removed. Tree stumps that have been uprooted will need to be removed in their entirety. Any cutup logs will need to be neatly stacked on the property. These requirements will apply to any landscaped area of the property which includes all lawn areas, planted areas, and garden areas. Any tree damage that occurred in naturally wooded areas can be cleaned up at the option of the property owner or left in its natural condition.

Thank you for your continued cooperation in keeping Montvale looking great as we look forward to a warm and enjoyable spring and summer for all residents.






Keeping the Home Safe

Recreational Activities and Programs

At this time, all Montvale Recreation programs have been suspended indefinitely. All parks, playgrounds, fields, courts and recreational facilities have been closed in addition to field use permits being suspended. This measure was taken as a result of the recommendations from the CDC and the Governor's Office, which have both strongly discouraged social gatherings in order to limit the risk of spreading COVID-19. When we are able to resume recreational programming and activities, announcements will be sent out via email, the Borough website, the Borough Facebook page and the Recreation Facebook page.
