The Mayor's Corner

Usually during this time of the year we are talking about the summer activities, the Day in the Park and the Street Fair, but this year is different, or is it? During the past three months we all had our lives turned upside down. At the time of this writing, we have had 84 residents tested positive with the COVID-19 virus and we lost five residents. With this crisis affecting all of us, it has particularly affected the small and medium size businesses. Unfortunately, some of these businesses will not be able to come back and that is true for retail and office space. We will have vacant offices and several retail stores. We will be working hard with the resources available to fill these spaces.

I also want to update you on the summer activities. We are bound by the state orders and we are obligated by law to follow these orders and open internal and external space based on the guidance from the state and the county. The Recreation Department will be issuing the detail on the Day in the Park and the fireworks and the Chamber of Commerce has delayed the Street Fair to October, and more detail will be coming on that.

As of now, all of the town services are back to normal. Borough Hall is open with regular hours and with complete safe distancing and

sanitizing equipment. Our Mayor & Council meetings will continue to be done over Zoom video and of course all of us are always available to meet with you onsite, at the office, or with Zoom video.

The Road Paving Program will start soon, all while PSE&G is updating the gas lines in town, we will ensure that they know which roads are being repaved. Coordinating these activities seems simple. I know it's not because last year we gave PSE&G a list of the streets that we are going to be paving and weeks after we were enjoying the newly paved streets, we were notified that these streets will need to be reopened for maintenance. So this year we will have them sign a contract and ensure that they know our street program and work with us keeping the communication lines open.

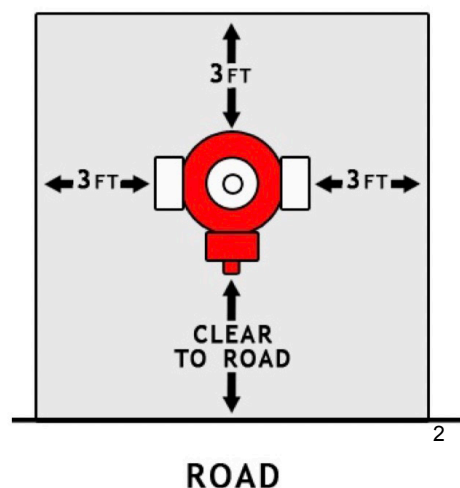

Annual Seasonal Flu Vaccination Clinic

In the past, the Board of Health would be preparing for the annual flu clinic and ordering seasonal flu vaccines. However, with the COVID-19 virus effecting our community and state, this has changed. The Northwest Bergen Regional Health Commission, our contracting provider, has decided on the side of precaution to cancel the Annual Flu Vaccination Clinic this year.

The Board of Health wishes to remind all residents of the importance of a seasonal flu vaccination and the importance of remaining current with all immunizations. Eligible residents are strongly advised to obtain a seasonal flu vaccine given by appropriate physicians or the local pharmacy.

Montvale Fire Prevention Reminds Residents To Leave Fireworks to the Experts

Summer is synonymous with barbecues, parades and fireworks. The National Safety Council advises everyone to enjoy fireworks at public displays conducted by professionals, and not to use any fireworks at home. They may be legal but they are not safe. Every year, young children can be found along parade routes and at festivals with sparklers in hand, but sparklers are a lot more dangerous than most people think. Sparklers burn at about 2,000 degrees – hot enough to melt some metals. Sparklers can quickly ignite clothing, and children have received severe burns from dropping sparklers on their feet. According to the National Fire Protection Association, sparklers alone account for more than 25% of emergency room visits for fireworks injuries. Fire Prevention Office recommends using safer alternatives, such as glow sticks, confetti poppers or colored streamers to celebrate.

Voting Primary

In light of the coronavirus pandemic and Executive Order No. 144, ALL DEMOCRATIC AND REPUBLICAN REGISTERED VOTERS WILL AUTOMATICALLY RECEIVE A VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOT for the July 7, 2020 Primary Election. If an Unaffiliated or Inactive Status Voter would like to participate in the Primary, they should complete and return the Vote-by-Mail Application that will be sent to them.

If you want to participate in the Primary Election, use the Mail-In Ballot and prepaid postage envelope that will be issued to you. Should you choose to not vote on the Mail-In Ballot and show up to one of the limited polling places on Election Day, you will only be able to cast your vote using a PROVISIONAL PAPER BALLOT. The voting machine is only for voters with disabilities who need the accessible voting device.

ALL MONTVALE VOTERS IN ALL DISTRICTS 1, 2, 3 & 4 POLLING LOCATION WILL BE AT THE MONTVALE SENIOR COMMUNITY CENTER.

Mailed ballots must be postmarked no later than 8:00 PM on July 7, 2020. The deadline for delivering your ballot in-person to the Board of Elections, or placing it in one of the secure drop boxes, is 8:00 PM on July 7, 2020.

The Tri Boro Food Pantry Stays Open Amid Pandemic

The Tri Boro Food Pantry is still serving the community during the coronavirus outbreak. The increase of unemployment and food insecurity has caused a surge in patrons. The number of families we see on a weekly basis has more than doubled. We are busier than ever and have less food than ever, which is troubling. The pantry is largely reliant on patronizing local grocery stores. With the new shopping limits set in place at the grocery stores, we are unable to restock our shelves and the inventory at the pantry has become dangerously low. Our secondary source of food is the generosity of the community. Without recent food donations, our doors would have been closed already. At this point we are making an urgent plea to the community for unexpired food donations. While nonperishables are preferred, we are grateful for any donations. Donations can be made at the Pantry on Tuesdays and Thursdays 9am-12pm or by appointment at 201-573-9083.

We are currently filling bags with: Hot cereal, cold cereal, macaroni and cheese, canned fruit, tuna fish, peanut butter and jelly, pasta, rice, dried beans, canned soup and canned vegetables. Thank you for helping us help the community!

- A staff member will call or email you when your items are ready.
- Pick up your 'Grab and Go' bag on the table in front of the art gallery between the building's entrance and the library's entrance from 10 am to 4pm.
- Your bag will be labeled with the last four digits of your library card barcode as well as your last name.
- Items must be in stock in our library for you to order them.

This is subject to change at any time, but we are greatly looking forward to seeing you all as soon as we are able to open to the public. Recreational Programs

At this time, all Montvale Recreation programs have been suspended indefinitely. This measure was taken as a result of the recommendations from the CDC and the Governor's Office, which have both strongly discouraged social gatherings in order to limit the risk of spreading COVID-19. Tennis

The Memorial Drive and LaTrenta Field Complex tennis courts are open as of May 22, 2020. Players must adhere to the restricted play rules (found at the bottom of this page and displayed at the courts) until further notice. Once you pay for a badge online, please email MontvaleRecreation@montvaleboro.org to coordinate your badge retrieval.

Adult - \$30
Child (17 and younger)- \$10
Family Max - \$50
Seniors 62 & up – Free

Non-Resident Fees:

Adults- \$60
Child (17 and younger)- \$20
Family- \$100
Non-Res Senior- \$10

Court Accessibility

A magnetic lock access system is used on the gates at both tennis court sites in town. This system has reduced the number of non-registered people using our courts.

Using The Access Badge

When entering: simply put your card in close proximity to the reader.
When leaving: Push the button on the door panel to open the gate.

Each family will be issued only one access card. These cards are not transferable and will be good for only one season.

If you lose your card, a replacement card can be obtained by emailing MontvaleRecreation@montvaleboro.org an additional \$10 fee.

During this time of restricted play, due to Covid-19, guest passes are not available.

CourtLights

Unless interrupted temporarily due to power outage, the following schedule will remain in effect for the season:

Memorial Courts:

April 1 – April 30 Dusk to 9pm

May 1 – Aug. 31 Dusk to 10pm

Sept. 1 – Oct. 31 Dusk to 9pm

Chestnut Ridge Courts:

April 1- April 30 Dusk to 9pm

May 1 – Aug. 31 Dusk to 10pm

Sept. 1 – Oct. 31 Dusk to 9pm

Rules and Regulations

Each player should review the list of rules and regulations outlined in this pamphlet.

1. Access cards are non-transferable. A charge of \$10 will be made to replace a lost access card.
2. Only players are permitted inside the courts.
3. Playing time is limited to one hour when other players are waiting.
4. Children 12 years and will be limited to ½ hour playing time after 6:00pm on weekdays, weekends and holidays if players are waiting.
5. Players must wear tennis shoes.
6. Playing with more than 3 balls on a court is prohibited.
7. No professional lessons permitted without the authorization of the Recreation Department.
8. Courts will be monitored by Recreation Department personnel and members of the Montvale Police Department.

Restricted Play Rules During Covid-19 Pandemic:

1. Feeling Sick? DO NOT PLAY
2. Been in contact with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms? DO NOT PLAY.
3. Doubles Play is prohibited. Singles Play Only.
4. Playing time is still limited to 1 hour when others are waiting.
5. Keep six feet apart from other players. No physical contact.
6. Use every other court where practical.
7. Avoid using your hands to pick-up balls. Use your racquet/foot to pick-up balls and hit them to the opponent.
8. Avoid touching your face after handling a ball, racquet or other equipment.
9. Bring different numbered/marked balls for each player to allow serving. Otherwise use rally scoring (no serving) if this is not possible.
10. Avoid handshakes and high fives.
11. Avoid gatherings. Arrive max of 10 minutes before play and vacate the court when the game is complete.

Please note: Water fountains will not be available. Please come prepared with your own water.

ORDINANCE NO. 76-696

1. Members who violate these rules are subject to the suspension of membership.
2. It is unlawful for any person to use the Borough Tennis Courts without first registering with the Recreation Department. The Municipal Court has jurisdiction to impose fines for violations of this ordinance.

Pickleball

The pickleball courts located on Memorial Drive are open for play. Players must bring their own equipment and adhere to the below restricted play rules.

- Feeling Sick? DO NOT PLAY
 - Been in contact with someone who has COVID-19 symptoms? DO NOT PLAY.
 - Doubles Play is prohibited. Singles Play Only.
 - Playing time is still limited to 1 hour when others are waiting.
 - Keep six feet apart from other players. No physical contact.
 - Use every other court where practical.
 - Avoid using your hands to pick-up balls. Use your racquet/foot to pick-up balls and hit them to opponent.
 - Avoid touching your face after handling a ball, racquet or other equipment.
 - Bring different numbered/marked balls for each player to allow serving. Otherwise use rally scoring (no serving) if this is not possible.
 - Avoid handshakes and high fives.
 - Avoid gatherings. Arrive max of 10 minutes before play and vacate the court when game is complete.
 - Adhere to all CDC Covid-19 Guidelines and New Jersey Department of Health Guidelines.
- Please note: Water fountains will not be available. Please come prepared with your own water.
