Furry Friends Safety!

Although they may appear clean and healthy, animals can carry germs and bacteria, including domesticated animals as well.

In the event you are in a public area and an unfamiliar dog approaches:

- Stay still and remain calm.
- Do not panic, make loud noises, or run.
- Say "no" or "go home" in a firm, deep voice and stand with the side of your body facing the dog.
- Slowly raise your hands to your neck with your elbows in and wait for the dog to pass or slowly back away.
- Avoid direct eye contact with the dog.

It's best practice to avoid touching wild animals to prevent any illness or injury from occurring. According to the Center for Disease Control (CDC), the majority of rabies cases reported occur in wild animals such as bats, raccoons, skunks and foxes. Rabies is a preventable viral disease which spreads by the saliva of infected animals/mammals.

How can I tell if an animal has rabies?

Animals with rabies may act strangely. It's important to remember that not all animals with rabies will be aggressive or excessively drooling. Other animals may at timid, shy, tamed, or moving slowly. To reduce your risk of rabies, do not get close to any animal that you are unfamiliar with.

Signs and symptoms:

- General sickness
- Problem swallowing
- Excessive drool or saliva
- An animal that is overly aggressive
- An animal that bites at imaginary objects (sometimes called "fly biting")
- An animal that appears tamer than you would expect.
- An animal that's having trouble moving or may even be paralyzed.
