## The Mayor's Corner

I hope you had an enjoyable summer and getting ready for the fall and winter activities. I have been actively involved with the Mayor's Wellness Campaign, and met many of you during these events. I will also be starting the Walk with the Mayor program again on Saturday mornings starting on September 23rd at 9AM. Meeting location will be at

borough hall front door and will walk along the Wegman's path. I hope you find the time to join me on these walks.

We have been actively working with Veolia water company on a location for a new water tank installation. It will likely take approximately two years to have the water tank approved and installed, which should resolve many of the water pressure issues for both the west and east side of town.

I am also excited to share with you that we are close to finishing the process to acquire the DePerio property on Craig Road and making it a town asset for future use for our residents to enjoy. As we get closer to making the decision on the use, I will let you know immediately. My preference (and it is shared by all the council members), is to keep it as a farm and to involve the community with a community garden on site and a working farm at the same time.

Finally, I would like to bring to your attention a warehouse project that is being proposed in the Village of Chestnut Ridge, directly on the border of Montvale, north of Spring Valley Road and immediately adjacent to the Alexa townhouses in Montvale. I have been in direct contact with the mayor of Chestnut Ridge Village, and I will be testifying during their next planning board meeting with opposition to this plan based on traffic and narrow roadways constraints, and the negative impact a warehouse operation would bring to not only New Jersey residential units but also to New York's upcoming residential units directly across from the proposed warehouse structure. The developer has been arguing that the truck traffic will operate northbound toward the Thruway and that trucks will not travel southbound on Spring Valley Road (a county road). I don't believe there is any way that this is accurate.

Of course, the Borough of Montvale has no jurisdiction outside of its borders, but we do maintain a courteous and a neighborly relationship with Chestnut Ridge Village and have several mutual aid agreements with the Village. Mayor Rosario Presti and I met and spoke several times about this project and other ongoing projects. We worked together in the past on other local issues pertaining to our towns, and we continue to keep the line of communication open. I will keep you posted as this application progresses.

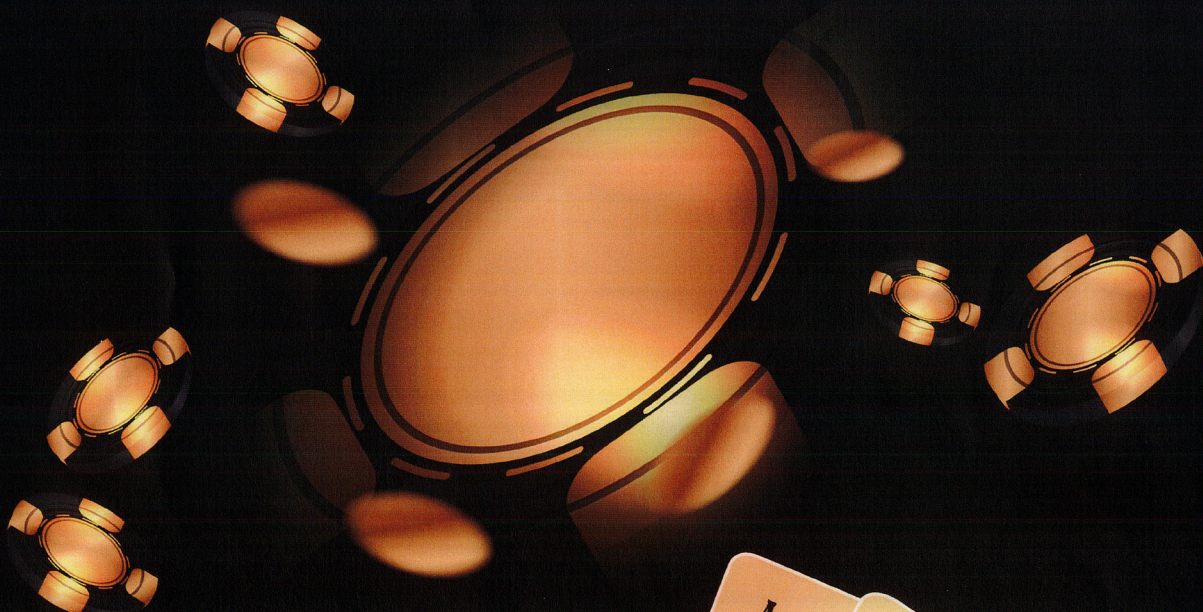

# Alpha-Gal Syndrome (AGS)

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released two publications describing the geographic distribution of Alpha-gal Syndrome (AGS), an emerging and potentially life-threatening allergic condition.

**Alpha-gal can be found in meat (such as pork, beef, rabbit, lamb, and venison) and products made from mammals (including gelatin, cow's milk, and milk products).**

The CDC also reports that between 2010-2022, there were more than 110,000 suspected cases of AGS. However, because the diagnosis requires a positive diagnostic test and a clinical exam, as many as 450,000 people might be affected by AGS in the United States.

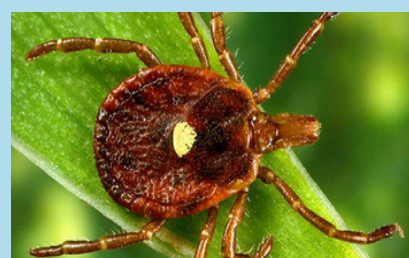
Reactions may vary from person to person, ranging from mild, severe, and life-threatening.

Symptoms can include but are not limited to:

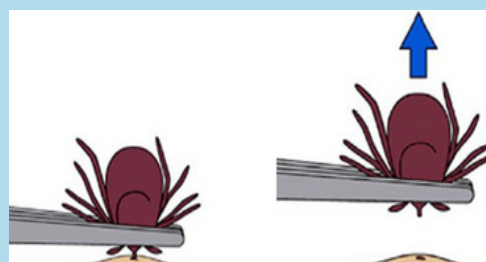
- Hives or itchy rash.
- Nausea or vomiting.
- Heartburn or indigestion.
- Diarrhea.
- Cough, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing.
- Drop in blood pressure.
- Swelling of the lips, throat, tongue, or eyelids.
- Dizziness or faintness.
- Severe stomach pain.

\*If you think you have been exposed to AGS, it's strongly recommended to discuss this with your primary care provider. Please seek immediate emergency care if you are having a severe allergic reaction.

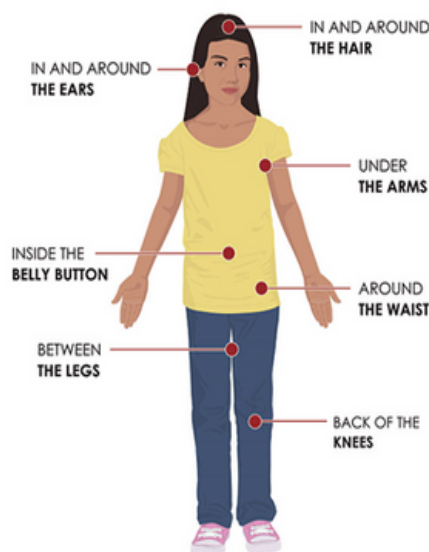

## Pickleball Court Badges

Badges must be obtained to use the pickleball courts. Resident badges do not expire while non-resident badges must be renewed each year. Badges for the 2023 season will become available starting January 3 at Borough Hall, 12 DePiero Drive, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4:30pm.

Badges must be worn in a visible location at all times while on the pickleball courts. Individuals using the pickleball courts must be able to present their own badge on demand by any Borough Official (Police Officer, Park Monitor, Municipal Employee, etc.) to verify authorized use of the facility. Individuals who fail to present a valid badge shall immediately leave the court.

Badges must be obtained to use the basketball courts. Resident badges do not expire while non-resident badges must be renewed each year. Badges for the 2023 season will be available at Borough Hall, 12 DePiero Drive, Monday-Friday, 8:30am-4:30pm starting January 3.
