I hope everyone had an enjoyable Holiday Season. On November 21st, our third Junior Police Academy class graduated after 10 weeks of intense and exciting training. I can say that it was a tremendous success with 16 7th and 8th grade students from Fieldstone School graduating.

Thank you to Sergeant Brian Lamendola for the great job he did running the program. I would also like to thank the Officers from the Montvale Police Departments, and all the volunteers who donated the time to make this program work. Also, a special thanks to the parents of the children who were part of the Junior Police Academy. Thank you for allowing them to participate. Thanks also to the Montvale Schools Administration for allowing us to use Fieldstone School for our classes.

Some of the highlights of the training included demonstrations by the Bergen County SWAT team, Bergen County bomb squad and K9 unit, Tri Boro Ambulance Squad, and the Montvale Fire Department, as well as a trip and full tour of MetLife Stadium. This year, the Montvale Fire Department is celebrating our 100TH Year Anniversary. Up until 1924, fire protection was provided by the Park Ridge and Pearl River Fire Departments. In 1924, 27 residents signed up to be regular members, and 11 residents signed up to be associate members. These members, the start of The Montvale Fire Department went out and purchased 3 fire extinguishers on their own.

Property Maintenance

This is a friendly reminder of what is required from you for all residents to be safe when venturing out during the winter months around our beautiful town. § 347-26Removal of snow and ice. [Amended 4-9-1996 by Ord. No. 96-1021] A. The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of land abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks and gutters of the public streets, avenues and highways within the limits of the Borough of Montvale shall remove all snow and ice from the same within 24 hours of daylight after the same shall have formed or fallen thereon. [Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II)] B. No person shall sweep, shovel, push, plow or throw snow or ice in or upon any public street, sidewalk or private property belonging to another, nor shall any person direct, permit or suffer another to so do any of the foregoing from any property owned, occupied, used or leased by such person.

Please try and abide by the law and keep your sidewalks clear from ice and snow.

Protecting Yourself and Others from Norovirus

Norovirus Illness: Key Facts

Norovirus—the stomach bug

Norovirus is a highly contagious virus. Norovirus infection causes gastroenteritis (inflammation of the stomach and intestines). This leads to diarrhea, vomiting, and stomach pain.

Norovirus illness is often called by other names, such as food poisoning and stomach flu. Noroviruses can cause food poisoning, as can other germs and chemicals. Norovirus illness is not related to the flu (influenza). Though they share some of the same symptoms, the flu is a respiratory illness caused by influenza virus.



Anyone can get norovirus illness

- · Norovirus is the most common cause of acute gastroenteritis in the U.S.
- Each year, norovirus causes 19 to 21 million cases of acute gastroenteritis in the U.S. There are many types of norovirus and you can get it more than once.

Norovirus illness can be serious

- Norovirus illness can make you feel extremely sick with diarrhea and vomiting many times a day.
- Some people may get severely dehydrated, especially young children, the elderly, and people with other illnesses.
- Each year, norovirus causes 56,000 to 71,000 hospitalizations and 570 to 800 deaths, mostly in young children and the elderly.

Norovirus spreads very easily and quickly

- It only takes a very small amount of norovirus particles (fewer than 100) to make you sick
- People with norovirus illness shed billions of virus particles in their stool and vomit and can easily infect others.
- You are contagious from the moment you begin feeling sick and for the first few days after you recover.
- Norovirus can spread quickly in enclosed places like daycare centers, nursing homes, schools, and cruise ships.
- Norovirus can stay on objects and surfaces and still infect people for days or weeks.
- Norovirus can survive some disinfectants, making it hard to get rid of.


Norovirus can spread in many ways

Norovirus can spread to others by-

- having direct contact with an infected person, for example, touching an infected person while caring for them,
- eating food or drinking liquids that are contaminated with norovirus,
- touching objects that have norovirus on them and then putting your fingers in your mouth, for example, touching a countertop that has vomit droplets on it and then putting your fingers in your mouth and
- sharing utensils or cups with people who are infected with norovirus.

There's no vaccine to prevent norovirus infection and no drug to treat it

- Antibiotics will not help with norovirus illness because antibiotics do not work on viruses.
- When you have norovirus illness, drink plenty of liquids to replace fluid loss and prevent dehydration.
- If you or someone you are caring for is dehydrated, call a doctor.
