I had the chance to update the Pascack Valley Mayors and the Chamber of Commerce on the happenings and activities for us in the coming year. I want to share with you the same information. Pre-covid in Montvale, we had about 8,000 residents and 20,000 daytime employees and less than 5% corporate office vacancy rate. Today, we have close

to 9,500 residents and will be around 10,500 by next year, and less than 7,000 daytime employees with about 20% corporate office vacancy rate. That's our current landscape.

We are spending \$30 million to expand our schools and working with the town's fifty-year-old sewer system. Fair Share Housing Center doesn't understand any of this, so we are planning to make the case that we have built more than 300 affordable units, close to 10% of the borough's housing stock, and now it's time to pause and assess the state of our infrastructure.

The Mayor's Corner

We bought 28 acres last year for \$4.5 million, and are now in the process of selling it to Veolia water for \$4.725 million to put necessary water infrastructure that will serve Montvale and our friends in River Vale. We are also about to purchase the last DePiero Farm property for five million dollars and will keep it a farm,

community garden, and a pick your own strawberry farm on Craig Rd. We also bought a property on Kinderkamack Road and we are building six units for disabled veterans on it and currently own other properties for future uses.

As for commerce, we have two committees working to not only retain current corporate and business tenants but to attract new ones. We decided that we want to brand Montvale as a "medical hub". The doctors, nurses, medical professionals, vendors, suppliers and patients will need to eat and shop, and we planned restaurants and small businesses around the hub to provide these services. That is commerce in the Pascack Valley and that is our mission to continue with in 2024.

We are generating about four million dollars in added tax revenue every year from the new development. The schools get about 2.5 million, we get about one million and the county gets half a million.

Property Maintenance

As we get into the warmer weather, our attention will turn to yard cleanup from the winter we had in our area. Individual residents and property owners will need to assess any damage to their property. All branches laying on the ground as well as broken branches still hanging in the tree will need to be removed. Tree stumps that have been uprooted will need to be removed in their entirety. Any cutup logs will need to be neatly stacked on the property. These requirements will apply to any landscaped area of the property which includes all lawn areas, planted areas, and garden areas. Any tree damage that occurred in naturally wooded areas can be cleaned up at the option of the property owner or left in its natural condition.

Garbage cans cannot be put out until 5:00pm the night before scheduled pick up and the empty cans need to be taken in and placed out of site by 8:00pm the night of the schedule day pick up.

Thank you for your continued cooperation in keeping Montvale looking great as we look forward to a warm and enjoyable spring and summer for all residents.

2023 Senior Freeze Applications(Blue Booklets)

The State of NJ began mailing 2023 applications on or about February 12, 2024.

Important Program Changes for Eligibility Requirements:

You (or your spouse/civil union partner) were 65 or older on December 31, 2022; or Actually, receiving federal Social Security disability benefit payments (not benefit payments received on behalf of someone else) on or before December 31, 2022.

Beginning with the 2023 filing season, new legislation increased the income limit for the program to \$150,000 for Tax Year 2022, and \$163,050 for Tax Year 2023, benefitting those filing the 2023 PTR-1. The law also eliminated the requirement that an applicant must be a New Jersey resident for 10 consecutive years to be eligible for the program. The age/disability and three-year homeownership requirements remain unchanged.
