AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING THE BOROUGH CODE TO ADD A NEW CHAPTER 10, "BASKETBALL COURTS," TO REGULATE THE USE OF PUBLIC BASKETBALL COURTS IN THE BOROUGH

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale has encountered difficulties in the administration of the use of its public basketball courts, which has resulted in loud and boisterous behavior and an abundance of trash and other items being left on public property, and which has prevented certain children from being able to utilize the basketball courts; and

WHEREAS, in order to ensure that all players are given a fair opportunity to play on the basketball courts in the Borough of Montvale, the Mayor and Council have determined that it is necessary to regulate the use of public basketball courts in the manner set forth in this Ordinance.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The Code of the Borough of Montvale is hereby amended and supplemented by adding a new Chapter 10, "Basketball Courts," as follows:

Chapter 10 Basketball Courts

§ 10-1. Definitions.

A. Certain words in this Chapter are defined for the purpose thereof as follows:

CHILD — Any person who shall not have attained the age of 13 years.

GUEST — Any person, other than a member, who has paid a fee for the use of the above-mentioned facilities at an hourly rate.

MEMBER — Any person who shall have paid an annual fee and receiving identification evidencing such payment for the use of the facilities being the subject matter of this ordinance.

NONRESIDENT — Any person who shall reside and maintain his or her permanent residence outside the territorial limits of the Borough of Montvale.

RESIDENT — Any person who shall reside and maintain his or her permanent residence within the territorial limits of the Borough of Montvale.

B. Word usage. Words used in the present tense include the future; the singular number includes the plural, and the plural the singular.

§ 10-2. Use of facilities.

- A. Membership and guest identification required. It shall be unlawful for any person to use at any time the basketball courts located at the Memorial Field Complex in the Borough of Montvale unless and until such person shall have first secured from the Borough of Montvale an identification badge, in a form and displayed in a manner prescribed in regulations established by the Borough, evidencing such person's membership or guest privilege and upon payment of a fee, if applicable.
- B. <u>Application and payment for membership and guest passes</u>. Application and payment for membership and guest passes shall be made to the Montvale Borough Clerk at the municipal offices or at such other place as shall be prescribed in a regulation issued by the Borough of Montvale.
- C. <u>Display of membership and guest identification</u>. Evidence of membership or guest identification shall be in a manner prescribed by the rules and regulations promulgated by the Borough of Montvale.
- D. <u>Guest passes</u>. Residents may obtain a maximum of two (2) guest passes when applying for membership. Nonresidents shall not be entitled to obtain guest passes. Guest pass fees shall be as set forth in the rules and regulations adopted by the Governing Body. The member to whom the guest passes were issued must be present at all times a guest pass is used at the basketball courts.

§ 10-3. Time of play.

- A. Limit of play. On-court play shall be limited to 60 consecutive minutes; provided, however, that should no person or persons be awaiting court time, play may continue until others appear to exercise their playing privileges, in which event such players then on the court shall immediately retreat therefrom. Replay shall be allowed upon a player's positioning his or herself last in consecutive order of those waiting to play upon expiration of a player's court time.
- B. Aggregating court time. A player's permitted court time shall not be aggregated by the number of players participating at a given time.

§ 10-4. Term of membership.

- A. <u>Annual membership</u>. Membership shall be based on a calendar year commencing January 1 through December 31.
- B. <u>Apportionment of fee</u>. Membership fees shall not be apportioned or refunded based on expired or unexpired portions of the year.
- C. Special rules for Children's Court. One marked basketball court shall be reserved for children aged 12 and under, which shall be known as the Children's Court. Players may play on the Children's Court except that, if one or more children request to use the Children's Court, or if it appears that one or more children are waiting with the intention to play on the Children's Court, all such players over the age of 12 shall immediately vacate the Children's Court.

§ 10-5. Attire.

All players must wear shirts while on the courts.

§ 10-6. Fees.

Fees for use of the basketball courts shall be established by resolution of the Governing Body, with due consideration being given to recommendations of the Recreation Department with respect thereto. To the extent possible, said fees shall be substantially based upon the cost of providing the facilities; it being further provided that the refund or apportionment of any fee, based upon an expired or unexpired portion of the term of the program, service or season for which any such fee has been paid or is otherwise due, shall be specifically prohibited. It shall be expressly permitted to establish different rates for residents and non-residents, recognizing that residents already contribute through local taxes to the establishment and maintenance of the basketball courts.

§ 10-7. Right to promulgate rules and regulations; posting.

The Governing Body reserves the right to promulgate from time to time, by resolution, rules and regulations pertaining to the maintenance and operation of the facilities and the conduct of players, which rules and regulations, as the same may from time to time be amended and supplemented, shall be posted at the facilities. In addition, at the time of the submission of application for membership, the applicant shall be provided a copy of the rules and regulations and shall sign an acknowledgment of his or her agreement to abide by such rules and regulations.

§ 10-8. Violations and penalties.

- A. Penalties. Any person who shall violate the provisions of this Chapter shall be subject to a fine of not more than \$100 for the first offense and \$200 for each succeeding offense or violation.
- B. In addition, any persons who shall violate any provision of this Chapter or the rules and regulations promulgated hereunder shall be subject to suspension of membership or guest privileges for a period of one year from the date of conviction of a violation thereof.

§ 10-9. Jurisdiction.

The Municipal Court shall have jurisdiction to impose sanctions for violations of this ordinance.

Section 2. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. Savings Clause.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed pursuant to this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance. **Section 4.** Severability.

The various parts, sections and clauses of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be severable. If any part, sentence, paragraph, section or clause is adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of the Ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall become effective upon adoption and publication as required by law, but in no event sooner than July 15, 2018.

Administrator larossi-Alwan,

Pursuant to your request we have reviewed proposed Ordinance 2018-1454, regarding regulation of public basketball courts in the borough. We have the following questions, comments and concerns:

- 1. Who is responsible for monitoring identification?
- 2. Who is responsible for monitoring playing time?
- 3. Who is responsible for enforcing the wearing of shirts?
- 4. Who is responsible for removing adults from "Children's Court"?
- 5. Are children required to get and display permits to play on the "Children's Court"?
- 6. Will children playing without proper identification be subject to penalties or exempt?

Having the police enforce basketball court regulations will become problematic. Having the regular police become the "basketball court police" may be excessive. We suggest that a "Park Ranger" or some similar type of monitor be hired through the recreation department.

"Shirts v. Skins" basketball games are a normal and traditional part of pickup games. Once prohibited, can individuals be shirtless on the edge of the court while cooling down from playing? Since there are no shirt requirements for the rest of the recreational areas such as the tennis courts and baseball fields, are we sending a mixed message? Should shirts be required on all athletic fields and park areas?

We suggest that fencing along with a swipe card similar to the tennis courts be used for the basketball courts. Problems are few at the tennis courts as a result of the access security.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 4 OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE TO INCREASE THE MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PLENARY RETAIL CONSUMPTION LICENSES

WHEREAS, the number of plenary retail consumption licenses within the territorial jurisdiction is set by the New Jersey Division of Alcoholic Beverage Control ("ABC"); and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale is currently limited by the ABC to a maximum of four plenary retail licenses based on its population, exclusive of exemptions; and

WHEREAS, there are certain exemptions to the maximum number of plenary retail consumption licenses, including for establishments affiliated with a hotel/motel or theater; and

WHEREAS, Montvale Code §4-11 imposes a cap of five plenary retail licenses, <u>including</u> <u>exemptions</u>; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale is desirous of increasing the cap in its Code to allow for additional plenary retail consumption licenses under hotel/motel, theater, or other exemptions permitted by the ABC.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 4, "Alcoholic Beverages," of the Code of the Borough of Montvale, Section 11, "Limit on plenary retail consumption licenses," is hereby amended and supplemented by adding the <u>underlined</u> text and deleting the [bracketed] text, as follows:

§4-11 Limit on plenary retail consumption licenses.

The Mayor and Council does hereby limit the number of plenary retail consumption licenses to be issued to a maximum of six [five] licenses.

Section 2. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances.

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section 3. Savings Clause.

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed pursuant to this Ordinance, nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this Ordinance.

Section 4. Severability.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 128, "ZONING," TO PROHIBIT MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENTS AND VAPOR ESTABLISHMENTS, INCLUDING THE CULTIVATION, TESTING OR MANUFACTURING OF MARIJUANA OR VAPOR PRODUCTS AS WELL AS ADVERTISING CONCERNING SAME IN THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE

WHEREAS, the State of New Jersey is considering legalizing marijuana for recreational use, allowing for the distribution and consumption of marijuana within New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale is concerned about the impacts of the legalization of marijuana on the health, safety and welfare of the public and specifically with respect to children; and

WHEREAS, in light of the circumstances present in many other states that have legalized marijuana for recreational use, the Borough of Montvale hereby finds that businesses selling, cultivating, growing, processing or which are otherwise involved in the distribution of marijuana pose specific and articulable concerns, including but not limited to security, the sale or re-sale of marijuana to minors, the health of employees and patrons, patrons driving under the influence of marijuana, connection to organized criminal activity, and the sale of unlicensed products in such establishments; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale is therefore desirous of banning the sale of marijuana and associated paraphernalia, and operations related to the cultivation, testing or manufacturing of such products, within the territorial jurisdiction of the Borough of Montvale; and

WHEREAS, electronic smoking devices, commonly known as "e-cigarettes," "e-cigars," "e-pens, "vape pens" or similar names, are battery-operated devices designed to look like and be used in the same or a similar manner as conventional tobacco products; and

WHEREAS, electronic smoking devices often contain liquid or cartridges that contain liquid nicotine and other chemical, and which can sometimes be filled or re-filled with liquid solutions containing controlled substances, creating the potential for inhalation and exposure to controlled substances; and

WHEREAS, the United States Food and Drug Administration ("FDA") has conducted laboratory analysis of electronic smoking device cartridges and has found the presence of, among other things, diethylene glycol (an ingredient in antifreeze), tobacco-specific nitrosamines (human carcinogens), tobacco-specific impurities suspected of being harmful to humans, varied levels of nicotine despite identically-labelled cartridges, and particularly high doses of nicotine; and

WHEREAS, consumers currently lack information resulting from clinical studies about the safety and efficacy of electronic smoking devices, including with respect to second-hand exposure to the vapor emitted from electronic smoking devices; and

WHEREAS, the FDA has raised concerns about the use of electronic smoking devices and the marketing and advertising of such products towards young people; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale is concerned that the presence of social clubs and stores selling electronic smoking devices or other vapor products within the Borough would be detrimental to the health, safety and welfare of the public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Chapter 128 of the Borough of Montvale is hereby amended and supplemented by adding a new Section 9.3, "Certain uses related to marijuana and vapor products prohibited; definitions," as follows:

§128-9.3 Certain uses related to marijuana and vapor products prohibited; definitions.

A. Wherever used in this Chapter, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

ELECTRONIC SMOKING DEVICE means any non-combustible product that employs a heating element, power source, electronic circuit or other electronic, chemical or mechanical means, regardless of shape or size and which can be used to deliver nicotine or other substances in a solution, vapor or any form to the person inhaling from the device, including, but not limited to, vapor cartridge, liquid nicotine container, electronic cigarette, cigar, cigarillo, pipe or other form intended to be used with, or in, any such device.

LIQUID NICOTINE means any solution containing nicotine which is designed or sold for use with an electronic smoking device.

LIQUID NICOTINE CONTAINER means a bottle or other container of liquid, wax, gel or other substance containing nicotine, where the liquid or other contained substance is sold, marketed or intended for use in a vapor product but does not include containers prefilled and sealed by the manufacturer and not intended to be opened by the consumer.

MARIJUANA means all or parts of the plant genus Cannabis, whether growing or not, the seeds thereof, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant or its seeds (except those containing only resin extracted from the plant).

MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENT means a business, residence or other location where the cultivation, testing, manufacturing, dispensing, growing, extraction or retail sale of marijuana or marijuana paraphernalia takes place, or where services are offered that involve marijuana or marijuana paraphernalia.

MARIJUANA PARAPHERNALIA means any equipment, products, or materials of any kind which are used, intended for use, or designed for use in planting, propagating, cultivating, growing, harvesting, composting, manufacturing, compounding, converting, producing, processing, preparing, testing, analyzing, packaging, repackaging, storing, vaporizing, or containing marijuana, or for ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana into the human body.

VAPOR PRODUCT means electronic smoking devices, liquid nicotine, liquid nicotine containers, and similar products used, or intended to be used, with such products.

VAPOR ESTABLISHMENT means a business, residence or other location where the testing, manufacturing or retail sale of vapor products takes place, or where services are offered that involve vapor products.

- B. In all zoning districts in the Borough of Montvale, the following uses shall be prohibited:
 - Marijuana Establishments. This prohibition shall not include premises regularly in the business of providing prescription medicines under a license issued by the New Jersey Board of Pharmacy and only for the sale of medical marijuana having been prescribed by a licensed physician and dispensed by a licensed pharmacist.
 - 2. Vapor Establishments.
 - 3. Signs, billboards or other similar structures or devices that advertise or promote marijuana, marijuana establishments, vapor products or vapor establishments.

WHEREAS, the Borough of Montvale Police Department strives to provide a hiring process that allows for a wide range of applicants while still ensuring that said applicants meet stringent standards in order to be eligible for appointment to the Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Chief of Police has recommended revising and updating departmental educational requirements to expand the range of qualifications that allow for an individual to participate in the hiring process for the position of Borough of Montvale Police Officer, including the recognition of an individual's service in the Armed Forces as relevant experience; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is desirous of effectuating the changes recommended by the Chief of Police.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale, County of Bergen, State of New Jersey, as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. The following sections of Chapter 84 of the Code of the Borough of Montvale are hereby amended and supplemented by adding the <u>underlined</u> text and deleting the [bracketed] text, as follows:

§ 84-19. Duties of all Department members; qualifications; appointments.

- A. It shall be the duty of every member of the Police Department of the Borough of Montvale to acquaint himself or herself at all times with the ordinances of the Borough, the rules and regulations governing the Department and the general orders; to closely examine all cases where he may have reasons to suspect that an ordinance or a state law may be violated; and to report the same to the Chief of Police or, during his absence, the commanding officer in charge of the Department. Failure on the part of any member of the Department to comply with the requirements of this section shall be sufficient grounds for penalties that may be prescribed or, as the case may be, for immediate dismissal.
- B. All officers and members of the Police Department shall have, possess and exercise all of the powers of a constable and peace officer. They shall also be empowered to serve and execute all processes issuing out of a Police Court, Magistrate's Court or Justice's Court, by whatever the same may be known, of the Borough of Montvale, New Jersey.
- C. Qualifications. No person or persons shall be appointed an officer or member of the Police Department who has been convicted of a crime involving moral turpitude which would be, in the judgment of the appointing power, prejudicial to the morale of the Department.

D. Appointment.

- (1) Not less than four weeks' notice of the examination for appointment to the Police Department must be published at least once a week in a newspaper circulating in the municipality.
- (2) Said appointment shall be subject to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 40A:14-122 et seq.
- (3) Any person or persons appointed after the passage of this ordinance must be at least 18 years of age and have obtained an A.A.S. degree in criminal justice or police science with prior police experience, or a Bachelors of Arts or Science degree from an accredited college or university, or received an Honorable Discharge from one of the branches of the United States Armed Forces (Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines or Coast Guard) after serving two (2) or more years of active duty and having obtained 30 or more credits towards a degree from an accredited college or university. [or a B.S. in criminal justice or police science or a related field such as sociology or psychology from an accredited college or university.] [He] Such person must be of good moral character, sound in body and in good health and able to read and write the English language intelligently. It shall be lawful for the Mayor and Council to employ officers and persons [men] temporarily in case of emergency or for parts of a year in cases where their services are not required throughout the entire year and discharge them at the expiration of said temporary employment. At all times, all officers must be citizens of the United States.

Section 2. Repeal of Inconsistent Ordinances.

The audit of accrued time for compensated absences (unused sick and vacation days) revealed that there were minor differences in the recording of days used per the supporting attendance calendars, time cards and attendance reports. It was also noted that the January 2017 supporting attendance calendar was not available for audit.

Recommendation:

Continued efforts be made to ensure attendance records and supporting reports be in agreement and supporting attendance calendars be retained and available for audit.

Explanation and Corrective Action:

The minor differences in the recording of the days used between the supporting attendance calendars, time cards and attendance reports were the result of one employee being held responsible for the task of reconciling all of the documents. During the extended absence of the employee responsible for the attendance records, the supporting attendance calendar for January 2017 was misplaced and not available for audit.

Administration has assigned an additional employee to work with the time tracking system and assist in the reconciliation of the documents reporting the accrued time for compensated absences. All documents will be properly filed and available for audit.

BOROUGH OF HILLSDALE RESOLUTION 18165

RESOLUTION AGAINST REFERENDUM TO PERMIT WOODCLIFF AND STATE OF STA

WHEREAS the Borough of Hillsdale, Township of River Vale, Borough of Montvale and Borough of Woodcliff Lake are the constituent municipalities of the Pascack Valley Regional High School District ("PVRHS") as a result of a referendum passed by the voters of those towns in 1951 to form a regional high school district; and,

WHEREAS the PVRHS is recognized as one of the best high school districts in the United States and State of New Jersey due to its comprehensive and academically challenging educational program; and,

WHEREAS the PVRHS exemplifies the benefit of regionalization and shared services by local government entities; and,

WHEREAS the PVRHS is funded by the four constituent municipalities pursuant to a tax apportionment formula established by statute that provides the regional school district shall be funded according to equalized property values; and,

WHEREAS Woodcliff Lake seeks to withdraw from the PVRHS, and the question will be presented to the voters on October 2, 2018; and,

WHEREAS if Woodcliff Lake is permitted to withdraw from PVRHS, it would have a destructive impact upon the academic and extracurricular offerings provided to the students of PVRHS, as well as a loss of staffing/teachers to address the decrease of funding; and.

WHEREAS if Woodcliff Lake is permitted to withdraw from PVRHS, it would result in an increase of taxes to the residents of Hillsdale, Montvale and River Vale and any disruption to the District could impact property values in the constituent districts; and,

WHEREAS the Borough of Hillsdale and the Township of River Vale have pursued all legal remedies to prevent any disruption to PVRHS; and,

WHEREAS a date for a special election has been set for October 2, 2018 to permit the voters of Hillsdale, River Vale, Montvale and Woodcliff Lake to decide whether Woodcliff Lake should be permitted to withdraw from PVRHS;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council for the Borough of Hillsdale oppose any and all efforts by the Borough of Woodcliff Lake to withdraw from PVRHS because it would cause a significant disruption to the PVRHS, result in a reduction of educational offerings and extracurricular activities and impose a tax burden upon the taxpayers of Hillsdale.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the appropriate remedy would be a change in law regarding the statutory funding formula for regional school districts rather than attempting to withdraw from the school district and shift the financial burden to the taxpayers of the remaining constituent districts.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this Resolution shall be transmitted to the Mayor and Council in River Vale, Woodcliff Lake and Montvale, as well as the Boards of Education in Hillsdale, River Vale, Woodcliff Lake, Montvale and PVRHS.



Please be advised of my intention to retire from the position of Fire Official effective December 31, 2018.

As I stated in my budget memo of November 30, 2017, and in Mr. Ludwig's budget memo of November 30, 2016, the Borough should seriously consider making the Fire Official a full time position. It has become increasingly difficult to recruit sufficient qualified personnel to work on a part time basis, and the increased workload due to the new complexes in town will require more and more hours to perform the required inspections and state reporting.

As an alternative, the Borough could investigate the possibility of merging Fire Prevention Bureaus with Park Ridge and/or Woodcliff Lake, with a full time Fire Official and staff member, and utilizing existing part time inspectors. Since the Fire Prevention Bureaus are funded by business registration and permits and residential inspection fees, it should be relatively easy to allocate revenue and costs among the participating municipalities. The experience the three towns has had with the consolidation of the Municipal Courts serves as a good example of the efficiencies that can be realized through combined services.
