UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a. <u>Update Frank Rossi/Boswell Engineering/Huff Pond Status/Hurricane IDA/FEMA/Restoration</u> Of Huff Pond

Due to Hurricane Ida, the restoration that was previously done was wash away. FEMA will reimburse up to 75% of the damage. The cost to restore the damage is approximately \$133,000. It would be best to do this project in the Spring.

b. <u>2022 Health Benefits Determination/Borough Employees/Open Enrollment/Percentage of</u> <u>Contributions Employee Contributions Toward Medical Plans/Health Savings Account (HAS)</u> <u>Contribution</u>

Councilmember Lane explained that currently the borough offers 3 health plans. 28 employees that are in the high deductible plan contributes 10% of the premium, the rest of the employees that are on the alternate plans contribute 15% of the premium. The borough contributes towards the HSA accounts for those employees on the high deductible plan \$7,300 for a family plan and \$3,650 for a single plan. Councilmember Lane's recommendation is to continue with the current contributions. A motion by Councilmember Lane; seconded by Councilmember Koelling – a roll call was taken – all ayes

NEW BUSINESS:

a. <u>Energy Efficiency Audit Conducted/PSE&G/Lighting and HVAC Units</u> As a result of the audit of all municipal buildings for energy efficiency. The only building that will be upgraded is the LaTrenta fieldhouse for lighting. The total savings will be \$4.00.
