Hello Montvale,

Lately we have experienced a rash of theft activity at local gyms and fitness clubs. The thefts have occurred both inside the facilities with articles left in lockers (locked and unlocked), left on benches and counters, left lying around near exercise equipment, and outside in parked vehicles.

Use common sense when going to the gym. Do you need to bring a \$5000.00 watch with you when you go workout? Do you need to bring your entire wallet filled with all your ID's and credit cards when you go to an exercise class? Thieves count on you being distracted and will snatch your valuables as soon as they see an opening. If it's noticed that you wore expensive jewelry in but are not wearing it while working out thieves will look for your locker and attempt to steal your stuff. And as you have heard before, never leave valuables in plain sight in your car. Thieves know that when you go into the gym they have ample time to break into your vehicle and take whatever they can see.

If you can bring your own combination lock to the facility do so. That is a better defense than the lock built into the locker.

Northwest Bergen Regional Health Commission Celebrates 60Th Anniversary And Honors The Montvale Board Of Health

On June 19th a celebration was held in Waldwick by Northwest Bergen Regional Health Commission honoring their 60th anniversary of providing local public health services to municipalities in Bergen County. At the event, the Commission honored the Montvale Board of Health, one of the communities served by the Commission for their dedication to public health. Accepting the certificate of appreciation from Angela Musella, Health Officer of Northwest Bergen Regional Health Commission, is Joyce Cohen, President of the Montvale Board of Health.

Influenza Vaccination Program

The Montvale Board of Health will be holding its annual Flu Vaccination Program on Saturday September 23, 2017 from 9:00 am – 11:00 am at the Montvale Senior Center at 1 Memorial Drive, Montvale, NJ 07645.

Children ages 3-17 will be able to receive a preservative free flu shot, only if a parent or guardian is present. If a child between the ages of 3 and 8 is receiving the flu vaccine for the first time ever, they will need to get a second vaccination one month after receiving the first.

We will also be offering High Dose vaccine for those 65 years of age or older – the higher dose allows for older individuals to develop a better immune response to the flu virus. The cost is \$35 for those not covered by Medicare.

As in past years, it will be necessary for those receiving Medicare Part B to bring their Medicare Part B card to the Influenza Vaccine program in order to receive the influenza vaccine. The Montvale Health Department, through a contract with Northwest Bergen Regional Health Commission, will directly bill Medicare. A \$25.00 fee will be charged to those who do not have Medicare Part B. If you have a Medicare HMO, also known as Medicare Advantage, you may choose to go to your primary care provider or you can pay \$25.00 for a flu vaccination. Medicare HMO's will not be accepted at the flu program. If you are pregnant, please bring a note from your obstetrician.

Annual vaccination against influenza is again recommended by the Centers for Disease Control for any adult who wants to reduce the risk for becoming ill with influenza or of transmitting it to others. Seasonal influenza is an easily transmittable respiratory disease. Each year 5 to 20 percent of the U.S. population gets the flu. More than 200,000 people are hospitalized from flu complications, including 20,000 children, and 36,000 people die every year. The most effective strategy for preventing influenza is annual vaccination. For more information regarding the flu program, please contact Keri Tone at (201) 445-7217 extension 201.
