Mayor's Message

Welcome to the Town of Montvale. Offering a bucolic setting in northern Bergen County, Montvale is the idyllic home to residents and many business entities. Located less than 35 minutes from midtown Manhattan, Montvale offers the very best of Bergen County – proximity to NYC coupled with easy access to the many amenities of suburban life. Noted for its top rated public schools and highly skilled workforce, the town continues to attract corporate entities from Fortune 500 companies to nascent start-ups.

Quality of life is a priority amongst town residents. While the historic family farms have largely given way to a modern suburban economy, the town still boasts a wooded environment with attractive housing options for all ages and life stages. The family-oriented town offers a large stock of single family housing on lots ranging from less than one-half acre to multiple acres, but also offers attractive options for recent graduates, couples and empty nesters, including gated communities, townhouses and apartments. All public schools are located in town starting with the Memorial Elementary School, the Fieldstone Middle School and ultimately Pascack Hills High School. Pascack Hills is home to many leading-edge initiatives - its one-to-one laptop technology program for all enrolled students and world champion robotics team are just a few examples of the cutting edge education that is offered. Montvale is also home to the well-respected St. Joseph High School for those seeking a private high school experience. In addition, numerous other private schools are within a 10-15 minute car or bus ride such as Bergen Catholic High School, Don Bosco Academy, and the Academy of Holy Angels.

The town is managed by a publicly elected mayor and town council along with seasoned administrative professionals. Montvale boasts a first class volunteer fire company, a professional police department, and a top notch library. The volunteer Montvale Athletic League promotes and manages youth sports for children ages 3-14 in baseball, basketball, soccer, softball, track and field, football, and cheerleading. Residents can take advantage of the town-owned tennis courts, basketball courts, baseball and soccer fields. Houses of worship are within walking distance in the center of town.

Montvale is well stocked with shopping and dining options ranging from family owned businesses and restaurants to nationally known enterprises. The new Wegman's supermarket scheduled to open in September will be the first of its kind in northern New Jersey and will be complemented by several new shopping and dining establishments. Busy families and individuals can take advantage of multiple child care, fitness, pharmacy and personal service providers, all located in town.

Easy access is a hallmark of Montvale's location as it is bisected by the Garden State Parkway (Exit 172) which provides direct access to NJ Route 17, I87 and I287, the Tappan Zee Bridge as well as the George Washington Bridge and Lincoln Tunnel. Commuter bus services are provided from the Park and Ride Lot located in the Montvale Service Area on the Garden State Parkway and rail access to and from NYC is provided along the Pascack Valley train line at the Montvale train station.

Montvale is a growing and vibrant community of over 9,000 residents with a focus on maintaining the historic character of its town while at the same time working cooperatively with our corporate partners. The recent arrival of entities such as Memorial Sloan Kettering and Sharp Electronics along with the decision by KPMG to significantly expand in town are a testament to the fact that Montvale continually lives up to it's slogan of "Montvale For Business".

Offering a small town feel with historic homes and buildings, wooded lots and family owned businesses coupled with a town leadership that is both progressive and focused on the future, we are truly able to offer the best of all worlds – a premiere place to both live and work. Come and explore all that we have to offer in this northern corner of Bergen County. We are sure you will be impressed.

Hello Montvale,

First, I want to welcome the two newest officers to the Montvale Police Department, Russell DiLauri and Joseph Werba. Both officers have graduated the Bergen County Police Academy and are currently in our Field Training Program. Congratulations!

For summer - There are a number of tips to help keep your home safe while you are on vacation.

- Stop routine deliveries to your house. The mail, paper, water, and similar home deliveries piling up outside your door are sure giveaways that no one is home.
- Keep a light on inside the house in the evening. But put it on a timer. The same light on all night will look curious to thieves.
- Do not broadcast on social media that you are away. Your posts on Facebook, Twitter LinkedIn, Snapchat, Instagram and other accounts where personal details are routinely shared and often can be accessed by thieves combing the internet for potential targets.
- The spare key you keep in the fake rock fools no one. Thieves will check for the hidden spare key under your doormat, under the potted plant or in one of the other common hiding places people use. Remove the spare if you are away. Leave it with a neighbor or relative.
- Let the police know that you will be away. We have a registry where the patrol division will be notified that a residence is supposed to be unoccupied. This also provides us with the ability to contact you or a person you designate in the event of an emergency.
- · Have a trusted neighbor, friend or family member keep an eye on your house while you are away.





The sample ifinerary described below is approximately like the itinerary your group will be following during your stay with WHITE STAR TOURS. However, the exact times, days, and destinations may vary for your group.

Additionally, the park tells the story of Philadelphia's most iamous citizen, Benjamin Franklin, in Franklin Court, where I ranklin's home once stood.
