Licenses for dogs & cats may be purchased during the clinic. Only cash & checks made payable to *Borough of Montvale* are accepted.

In effort to save time, if you have received a license renewal application in the mail (in December) present it when licensing your pet(s). An application is available on borough website and at the clinic.

Dogs and cats that were inoculated at the 2016 Clinic must be inoculated in 2019. Vaccines are valid for three years, with proof of previous rabies vaccine.

\$18. –neutered/spayed pet \$21. –non neutered/spayed pet
\$10. – fee per pet if the owner is 55⁺ years (*proof may be required*)
