The Mayor's Corner

I want to start by recognizing and thanking the Montvale Chamber of Commerce members and all the volunteers who worked to make the 2019 Street Fair one of the most successful events. With near perfect weather and more than 20,000 people all having a great time, this event was a very successful one.

I toured the wooded property on Summit Avenue, along with our Police Chief Sanfilippo, Environmental Commission Chairman Bob Hanrahan and Advisory Committee member Jarret Schumacher. This is 17 acres in size with about 3 acres in flat land for parking. The owner will be building a trail and walkways along the wetlands and the dry lands for our residents to use. This will make a great recreational use with convenient parking. The owner has approval from 12 years ago for 170 assisted living units on the remaining 7 acres.

We are actively working to revive our downtown and upgrade some of the old buildings by the train station. We are expecting plans to update the gas station across from the railroad station, with an added coffee shop. Also, the old brown vacant building, the old furniture store, will also be upgraded to the current zoning allotment.

Hope everyone enjoys the summer and wishing you safe travels to your vacation destination. I will be local all summer, please feel free to reach out if I can be of any assistance.

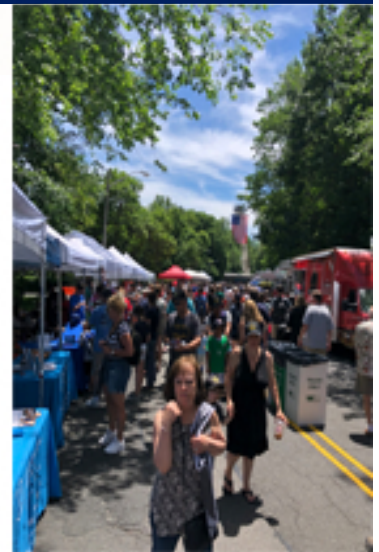
