#### We completed our budget review with all the department heads and more work needs to be done to ensure we utilize all our resources to reduce costs while maintaining and increasing the services in town. This winter has been mild so far and it allowed us to catch up on road work even with PSE&G roadwork taking place all around town. The agreement with PSE&G is that they will fully mill and pave any road paved in the last five years or less. More than five years, paved roads will be paved curb to half the road once all their work is completed.

Our COVID-19 positives seem to be leveling at an average of 70-80 active cases. Meaning there are that many residents who tested positive and should be quarantining. These numbers are updated several times a week, and I am hopeful that as we get more residents vaccinated, these numbers

### **Montvale Police Department**



Thanks to our Mayor and Council, we are the first Police Department in the Pascack Valley to purchase and deploy these cameras. ### **Property Maintenance**

This once again is a friendly reminder that unfortunately the winter is not yet over, as much as some of us would like that. Therefore, our ordinance for snow removal is being shown below so there is no confusion as to what is expected from you in order to keep our beautiful town safe for all. Thank you once again from the Building Department.

#### § 347-26Removal of snow and ice.

[Amended 4-9-1996 by Ord. No. 96-1021]

A. The owner or owners, tenant or tenants of land abutting or bordering upon the sidewalks and gutters of the public streets, avenues and highways within the limits of the Borough of Montvale shall remove all snow and ice from the same within 24 hours of daylight after the same shall have formed or fallen thereon.

[Amended at time of adoption of Code (see Ch. 1, General Provisions, Art. II)]

B. No person shall sweep, shovel, push, plow or throw snow or ice in or upon any public street, sidewalk or private property belonging to another, nor shall any person direct, permit or suffer another to so do any of the foregoing from any property owned, occupied, used or leased by such person.
