
Tri Boro Food Pantry

- The only insurance we accept is Medicare Part B
- We cannot accept Medicare Advantage plans (HMO, PPO, etc.)
- For all insurances other than Medicare Part B, the cost is \$25 (regular vaccine) or \$35 (high-dose vaccine). We accept cash or check only.
- If you are enrolled in a non-Medicare Part B plan (HMO, PPO, etc.), you may wish to receive your flu shot from your primary care physician, where there may be no charge.
- Medicare Part B participants MUST bring their Medicare Part B cards that we may bill Medicare.







Flu Prevention

Montvale Board of Health will be hosting its annual flu vaccine clinic on Saturday, October 8, 2022. Did you know there is a simple way of protecting yourself from getting sick with the flu? Getting your annual flu vaccine has many benefits for you and your loved ones. According to the CDC, for a two year flu season, 6,400,000-11,000,000 flu illnesses have been predicted. This virus can cause unnecessary illness, doctor visits, hospitalizations and even deaths. Receiving an annual flu vaccine can enable you to continue with your lives and not miss anything.

The flu virus constantly changes so, to have the best protection, getting the vaccine each year is necessary. Protection from the virus decreases over time so receiving a vaccine annually helps your body make new antibodies to defend itself. In addition, individuals with chronic health conditions can decrease the risk of experiencing complications from the virus that can lead to hospitalizations. The vaccination benefit for pregnant women reduces the risk of complications from the virus and gives immunity to the baby for a few months after birth. Children starting at the age of six months and older can also receive a vaccine.

If you have questions or concerns about the flu vaccine, please talk to your healthcare provider. The Board of Health will be hosting its annual flu vaccine clinic on Saturday, October 8, 2022 at the Montvale Senior & Community Center. Details about the clinic will be coming soon.

Property Maintenance Department

I am writing to the residents of Montvale to explain and clarify some issues as they relate to property maintenance in the borough.

In Montvale, we have an effective property maintenance program. Chapter 305 of the Montvale Code addresses everything covered in the operation of the department. It can be found on the borough website, Montvale.org under the Municipal Ordinances and Laws.

Various violations are more frequent than others and seasonal in nature. In the winter season, snow and ice on sidewalks is by far the most violated ordinance. In the fall, it is leaf removal. In the spring season, it is yard and structure clean up after a tough winter. And in the summer, it is weeds, tall lawns, overgrown landscaping, vehicles parked on the lawn, and unprotected pool enclosures. The initial complaints come through many sources, including anonymous tips, written complaints, phone calls, Mayor and Council, and visual inspection by myself. Our ordinance allows a 30-day period to abate a Property Maintenance Violation (PMV). Discretion is given to the enforcing official to amend that time frame and thus we allow 14 days to abate the PMV. This allows ample time for the violation to be addressed without letting it drag on or making the neighbors wait for some level of compliance. If a resident needs more than 14 days to comply, please call my office with an estimated date of compliance. Such requests are almost always granted. In the event there is no compliance after 14 days, the PMV is resent and an additional 10 days is allowed. Habitual offenders generally do not get an additional 10 but instead receive a summons. If after the additional 10-day period passes and there is still no compliance, the violation is photographed and a summons is issued via regular and certified mail. If there is compliance after the summons is issued but before the court date, then the file is reviewed for possible dismissal of the complaint. Warnings of violations are left with a RED door hanging notice. If not addressed, a PMV is issued. The Department must create a paper trail for the court should the violation ever reach that level of enforcement. The form of the PMV meets the legal requirements for such notices stating what the violation is, what is needed to abate the violation, the time frame in which it needs to be abated, and the penalty for non-compliance. The vast majority of property owners maintain their properties very well and that goes a long way to keeping the borough looking good and maintaining property values.
