BOROUGH OF MONTVALE

CALENDAR YEAR 2017 ORDINANCE TO EXCEED
THE MUNICIPAL BUDGET APPROPRIATION LIMITS
AND TO ESTABLISH A CAP BANK
(N.J.S.A. 40A-4-45.14)

WHEREAS, the Local Government Cap Law, N.J.S. 40A: 4-45.1 et seq., provides that in the preparation of its annual budget, a municipality shall limit any increase in said budget to 0.5% unless authorized by ordinance to increase it to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, subject to certain exceptions; and.

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A: 4-45.15a provides that a municipality may, when authorized by ordinance, appropriate the difference between the amount of its actual final appropriation and the 3.5% percentage rate as an exception to its final appropriations in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body of the Borough of Montvale in the County of Bergen finds it advisable and necessary to increase its CY 2017 budget by up to 3.5% over the previous year's final appropriations, in the interest of promoting the health, safety and welfare of the citizens; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body hereby determines that a 3.0% increase in the budget for said year, amounting to \$292,602.33 in excess of the increase in final appropriations otherwise permitted by the Local Government Cap Law, is advisable and necessary; and,

WHEREAS, the governing body hereby determines that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the governing body of the Borough of Montvale in the County of Bergen, a majority of the full authorized membership of this governing body affirmatively concurring, that, in the CY 2017 budget year, the final appropriations of the Borough of Montvale shall, in accordance with this ordinance and **N.J.S.A.** 40A: 4-45.14, be increased by 3.5%, amounting to \$341,369.38, and that the CY 2017 municipal budget for the Borough of Montvale be approved and adopted in accordance with this ordinance; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that any amount authorized hereinabove that is not appropriated as part of the final budget shall be retained as an exception to final appropriation in either of the next two succeeding years; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance as introduced be filed with the Director of the Division of Local Government Services within 5 days of introduction; and,

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED, that a certified copy of this ordinance upon adoption, with the recorded vote included thereon, be filed with said Director within 5 days after such adoption.

78-2017 Resolution Urging The Legislature To Reduce Local Affordable Housing Burdens And Provide Defined Rules And Relief In Providing Thereof

WHEREAS, municipalities do not have the resources to provide court mandated housing to comply with the Mount Laurel doctrine without proper funding; and

WHEREAS, lawsuits increase housing four-fold through court mandates and without an affirmative defense municipalities can do nothing to stop growth and sprawl, costing millions of dollars outside of local budgets; and

WHEREAS, property taxes must be raised exponentially to pay the costs associated with court mandates and, therefore, population, further overburdening taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, the cumulative impact of years of unfunded court mandates has left many municipalities with serious needs and burdensome property taxes; and

WHEREAS, expected state population growth of .3 percent does not provide sufficient demand to justify court-mandated 30 percent housing supply increase; further congesting our state; and

WHEREAS, New Jersey is already the most densely populated state in the country with 1,195 persons per square mile; and

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WHEREAS, the quality of life and public welfare in this municipality will be reduced, negatively impacting infrastructure, water and sewer capacities; school class sizes and school services; municipal services such as volunteer and staffed ambulatory services and fire departments, police departments, public transportation and traffic; and

WHEREAS, the lack of affordable housing and rentals is not due to a lack of units, rather it stems from residents paying property taxes that are unaffordable and increasing by roughly \$700 million annually; and

WHEREAS, the state of New Jersey should relieve the burden of unfunded court mandates and provide statewide parity and predictability in regard to municipal affordable housing obligations; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly is urged to pass Assembly Bill No. 4666 imposing an end-of- year moratorium on all affordable housing litigation; and Assembly Bill No. 4667 establishing the "Affordable Housing Obligation Study Commission" to assist in finding solutions to the affordable housing crisis foisted upon municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the Senate is urged to pass Senate Bill S3080 and S3081, which are companion bills to the aforementioned Assembly Bills; and

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the state and the legislature to assist municipalities; and

WHEREAS, the time has come to reasonably address affordable housing needs in New Jersey to preserve the integrity of the state and its quality of life; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Borough of Montvale urges the state and the legislature to aid municipalities over-burdened by court-mandated affordable housing; and be it further

RESOLVED, that we enthusiastically must reach a solution to affordable housing in New Jersey; and be it finally

RESOLVED, that certified copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Governor Chris Christie, Lieutenant Governor Kim Guadagno, Department of Community Affairs Commissioner Charles A. NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Borough Council does hereby formally request that the County of Bergen set aside sufficient funds in its 2017 budget to repair and/or replace the Magnolia Avenue bridge as soon as possible.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Council does further request that the County of Bergen take all steps necessary to ensure that one lane of the bridge is kept open at all times during repair and/or replacement of the bridge, due to the importance of Magnolia Avenue to the flow of traffic through the Borough.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Borough Clerk shall forward a copy of this Resolution to the County Executive and all members of the Board of Chosen Freeholders.

As a follow-up to the EC memo from October 2016 regarding the request from M&C to comprise a definition for "clear cutting" we now use the term "indiscriminant tree removal". As a follow-on effort with the interest of understanding the scope of the problem, the Montvale Environmental Commission invested in a study of tree removal events brought to the attention of the Borough over the last 5 years. The study resulted in the realization that out of 13 tree incidents, 10 of them came before the building department for a permit of some kind. Based on the outcome of the study and further discussion with the building department and residents we came to the conclusion that a single tree ordinance to satisfy all concerns is very difficult to institute and would continue to meet significant resistance. In addition we determined that a series of ordinances tied to the building department would be simpler to understand, simpler to manage, and limit the broad restrictions which took on public opposition. Rather than creating an all-encompassing tree ordinance covering many situations, we recommend multiple ordinances addressing tree removal during specific events and situations. The EC is respectfully submitting the following two tree ordinance concepts for consideration and investment. We believe these ordinances, if adopted, will make a significant impact on indiscriminant tree removal.

Ordinance #1: We understand a demolition permit is required by the Building Department before any removal of a building structure on commercial or residential property. The EC believes that an ordinance should be considered where it states that during demolition of a structure, removal of trees are not permitted outside the demolitions limits shown on a certified survey unless approved by the Montvale Environmental Commission. Violation of this ordinance should carry significant fines to ensure compliance.

Ordinance #2: This ordinance will encompass tree removal during and prior to residential construction and/or renovation on residential property zones (R-10, 15, 40, etc.). Ordinance states that tree removal is not permitted outside of a buffer area defined by the existing building setback outline as defined by existing zoning code. (In other words tree removal is not permitted within a buffer area around the perimeter of the property defined by the building setback defined by code for the specific residential zone.) To avoid tree removal prior to construction the ordinance could state that no construction permit will be granted if tree removal takes place within the buffer area within the 12 (or 24) months prior permit approval. Removal of trees inside the setback requires written approval by the Montvale Environmental Commission. Violation of this ordinance should carry significant fines to ensure compliance.
