Will ask EC Chairman, Bob Hanrahan to attend the next workshop session to further discuss b. Memorial Drive/Basketball Courts/Green Acres/Signage/Ordinance/Enforcement

Mayor Ghassali stated there have been numerous complaints about trash left all around, out of town kids using the courts, Montvale residents not having enough court time; The State researched their archives and no records have been found stating if the basketball courts were funded through Green Acres funding. Councilmembers suggested some options like putting up a fence, issuing passes, putting up signs about littering, playing loud music and foul language;

A few concerned residents suggested having certain times for out of towners; not allowing out of towners at all; more police patrolling the courts; this problem has been going on for over ten years; signs are good but will it be enforced

A motion to close the meeting to the public by Councilmember Lane; seconded by Councilmember Koelling

Councilmembers agreed to open the courts and patrol the area and report back at the next workshop session

NEW BUSINESS:

a. Request For Street Names/160 Spring Valley Road, LLC

The main street of the development will be named Ackerman Drive, and the three remaining streets will be Brandon Court, Premier Way, and Opus Way – Councilmembers approved all street names

Councilmember Weaver asked for clarification in regards to the Planning Board receiving an application for a D-Variance and to what extent do they have about using discretion; the attorney responded by saying if it is properly presented to the board, the board cannot refuse the application; the board follows the standards dictated in the Municipal Land Use Laws, that is their statutory obligation to analyze the application and render a decision, they are a quasi-judicial board and they have a right to hear the application and make a decision. Councilmember Weaver continued by saying what, if any, recourse does the governing body have; the attorney stated that the governing body or any other board does not have the right to interfere with the application.
