ORDINANCE NO. 2022-1519

BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN AND BY THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$1,690,000 THEREFOR AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$1,605,500 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE BOROUGH TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOROUGH COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE, IN THE COUNTY OF BERGEN, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Borough of Montvale, in the County of Bergen, New Jersey (the "Borough") as general improvements. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there are hereby appropriated the respective sums of money therein stated as the appropriation made for each improvement or purpose, such sums amounting in the aggregate to \$1,690,000, and further including the aggregate sum of \$84,500 as the several down payments for the improvements or purposes required by the Local Bond Law. The down payments have been made available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the several improvements or purposes not covered by application of the several down payments, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$1,605,500 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefor, the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

The excess of the appropriation made for each of the improvements or purposes aforesaid over the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued therefor, as above stated, is the amount of the down payment for each purpose.

All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as Section 4. may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no bond anticipation note shall mature later than one year from its date, unless such bond anticipation notes are permitted to mature at such later date in accordance with applicable law. The bond anticipation notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with bond anticipation notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the bond anticipation notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law or other applicable law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the bond anticipation notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the bond anticipation notes pursuant to this bond ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the bond anticipation notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Borough hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Borough is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with

the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

- Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:
- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not current expenses. They are all improvements or purposes that the Borough may lawfully undertake as general improvements, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The average period of usefulness, computed on the basis of the respective amounts of obligations authorized for each purpose and the reasonable life thereof within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, is 10.11 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Borough as defined in the Local Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$1,605,500, and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.
- (d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$300,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purposes or improvements.

Section 7. The Borough hereby declares the intent of the Borough to issue bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use the proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance. This Section 7 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of the Treasury Regulations.

Section 8. Any grant moneys received for the purposes or improvements described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvements or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this bond ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 9. The chief financial officer of the Borough is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Borough and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Borough. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Borough pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Borough and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Borough fails to comply with its undertaking, the Borough shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 10. The full faith and credit of the Borough are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Borough, and the Borough shall be obligated to levy *ad valorem* taxes upon all the taxable property within the Borough for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 11. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-1520

AN ORDINANCE OF THE BOROUGH OF MONTVALE AMENDING AND SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 130 OF THE BOROUGH CODE TO EXPRESSLY PROVIDE FOR THE MUNICIPAL EXTENSION OF AFFORDABILITY CONTROLS

WHEREAS, COAH's Uniform Housing Affordability Control ("UHAC") regulations provide that all units restricted to be affordable to low- and moderate-income households ("affordable units") must remain subject to an initial control period of at least 30 years, after which a municipality may elect to release such units from the affordability controls; and

WHEREAS, implicit in this regulation is the discretion of a municipality to decline to release an affordable unit from the affordability controls at the end of the initial control period; and

WHEREAS, extending the controls on affordable units is an important tool available to municipalities to help ensure that adequate affordable housing is provided within its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, the Borough is desirous of explicitly acknowledging its own discretion to extend the control period on affordable for-sale and rental units within the Borough of Montvale, to ensure that adequate affordable housing is provided within the Borough.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Montvale as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Sections 130-13, "Control periods for restricted ownership units and enforcement measures," of the Borough of Montvale Code is hereby amended and supplemented by adding the underlined text, as follows:

§130-13 Control periods for restricted ownership units and enforcement measures.

A. Control periods for restricted ownership units shall be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.5, as it may be amended and supplemented, and each restricted ownership unit shall remain subject to the requirements of this chapter for a period of at least 30 years, until Montvale takes action to release the unit from such requirements; prior to such action, a restricted ownership unit shall remain subject to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1, as it may be amended and supplemented. The Borough shall have the sole discretion to release the controls, or extend the controls, at the expiration of the control period.

- B. The affordability control period for a restricted ownership unit shall commence on the date the initial certified household takes title to the unit.
- C. Prior to the issuance of the initial certificate of occupancy for a restricted ownership unit and upon each successive sale during the period of restricted ownership, the administrative agent shall determine the restricted price for the unit and shall also determine the nonrestricted, fair market value of the unit based on either an appraisal or the unit's equalized assessed value without the restrictions in place.
- D. At the time of the initial sale of the unit, the initial purchaser shall execute and deliver to the administrative agent a recapture note obligating the purchaser (as well as the purchaser's heirs, successors and assigns) to repay, upon the first nonexempt sale after the unit's release from the restrictions set forth in this chapter, an amount equal to the difference between the unit's nonrestricted fair market value and its restricted price, and the recapture note shall be secured by a recapture lien evidenced by a duly recorded mortgage on the unit.
- E. The affordability controls set forth in this chapter shall remain in effect despite the entry and enforcement of any judgment of foreclosure with respect to restricted ownership units.
- F. A restricted ownership unit shall be required to obtain a continuing certificate of occupancy or a certified statement from the Construction Official stating that the unit meets all Code standards upon the first transfer of title following the removal of the restrictions provided under N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.5(a), as it may be amended and supplemented.

<u>Section 2</u>. Sections 130-18, "Control periods for restricted units," of the Borough of Montvale Code is hereby amended and supplemented by adding the underlined text, as follows:

§130-18 Control periods for restricted units.

- A. Control periods for restricted rental units shall be in accordance with N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.11, as it may be amended and supplemented, and each restricted rental unit shall remain subject to the requirements of this chapter for a period of at least 30 years, until Montvale takes action to release the unit from such requirements. Prior to such action, a restricted rental unit shall remain subject to the requirements of N.J.A.C. 5:80-26.1, as it may be amended and supplemented. The Borough shall have the sole discretion to release the controls, or extend the controls, at the expiration of the control period.
- B. Deeds of all real property that include restricted rental units shall contain deed restriction language. The deed restriction shall have priority over all mortgages on the property, and the deed restriction shall be filed by the developer or seller with the Records office of the County of Bergen. The deed shall also identify each affordable unit by apartment number and/or address and whether that unit is designated as a very-low-, low- or moderate-income unit. Neither the unit nor its affordability designation shall change throughout the term of the deed restriction. A copy of the filed document shall be provided to the administrative agent within 30 days of the receipt of a certificate of occupancy.
- C. A restricted rental unit shall remain subject to the affordability controls of this chapter despite the occurrence of any of the following events:
 - (1) Sublease or assignment of the lease of the unit;
 - (2) Sale of other voluntary transfer of the ownership of the unit; or

(3) The entry and enforcement of any judgement of foreclosure on the property containing the unit.

<u>Section 3</u>. Any article, section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or other provision of the Borough of Montvale Code inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance is hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

<u>Section 4</u>. If any section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision of this ordinance shall be adjudged by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the section, paragraph, subsection, clause, or provision so adjudged, and the remainder of this ordinance shall be deemed valid and effective.

<u>Section 5</u>. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and publication as required by law.

As you are aware, the 2021 Road Program included milling and paving the following roads: Main Street (from Jefferson Place to the NYS border), Erie Avenue (from Main Street to Ladik Place), Marion Road (from Grand Avenue to Hemlock Street), Pennsylvania Avenue (from Myrtle Avenue to the end). Curbing replacement/installation was also required along Woodland Road (from W. Grand Avenue to Bayberry Drive), Highland Road (between 37 & 39 Highland) and along N. Kinderkamack Road (between 73 N. Colliers Engineering & Design (CED) has been retained by the Borough of Montvale ("Borough") to perform observations of the existing school bus operations along Fox Hill Road in the Borough of Montvale, Bergen County, New Jersey. The purpose of this memo is to discuss the traffic impacts of the proposed signage recommendations along Fox Hill Road, Lark Lane, and Wren Way. It is noted portions of Fox Hill Road and Wren Way extend across the state border into the Village of Chestnut Ridge, Town of Ramapo, Rockland County, New York. A site location map is enclosed as **Figure 1**. Previously, our office had performed field observations and collected traffic data within the study area. From our review of this information, we recommend the following improvements.

Recommended Improvements

It is proposed to create all-way stop conditions at each intersection and install No U-Turn signs to prohibit unsafe maneuvers in the middle of each intersection. The following recommendations are illustrated as **Figures 2 – 4**.

Fox Hill Road & Lark Lane

- Install one (1) new STOP sign (R1-1) and stop bar along the northbound approach of Fox Hill Road;
- Install three (3) new ALL WAY supplemental plaques (R1-3P) beneath each stop sign; and
- Install three (3) No U-Turn signs (R3-4) beneath each stop sign.

Fox Hill Road & Wren Way

- Install three (3) new STOP signs (R1-1) and stop bars along each intersection approach;
- Install three (3) new ALL WAY supplemental plaques (R1-3P) beneath each stop sign; and
- Install three (3) No U-Turn signs (R3-4) beneath each stop sign.

Lark Lane & Wren Way

- Install one (1) new STOP sign (R1-1) and stop bar along the westbound approach of Lark Lane;
- Install three (3) new ALL WAY supplemental plaques (R1-3P) beneath each stop sign; and
- Install two (2) No U-Turn signs (R3-4) beneath each stop sign along the eastbound approach of Lark Lane and along the southbound approach of Wren Way.

Conclusion

The proposed improvements along Fox Hill Road, Wren Way, and Lark Lane will enhance the safety of the intersections by eliminating unsafe U-turn maneuvers and allowing drivers a chance to assess traffic before moving through the intersections safely. Dear Mayor and Council Members,

Discussions with the Borough Engineer, Andrew Hipolit in January 2021 regarding traffic issues in the area of Lark Lane, Wren Way, and Fox Hill Road, resulted in my request to install temporary Stop signs at the intersections of Fox Hill Road and Lark Lane, and Lark Lane and Wren Way. The requested signs were installed by the Department of Public Works in July of 2021.

The installation of these signs seems to have had a positive affect on the slowing of traffic in the area. After further discussion with the Borough Engineer, and after reviewing the April 26, 2022 letter written by Jeffrey M. Fiore of Colliers Engineering and Design, Inc., which calls for several more signs to be installed in the area, I concur with his recommendations, and would request that the Council direct the DPW to permanently install the signs as outlined in Mr. Fiore's letter.
